HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association (VAAA) with our first State champions being W.S. Jones (hammer) and J.D. McRae (pole vault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the VAAA 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. In 2012, the Athletics Victoria Road Relay Championships being held at the Belmont Criterium on 11 August 12.

December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) was founded with Geelong women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan and John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964 –1966 saw the Geelong Centre assist in the formation of the Geelong Little Athletics Centre, the number 1 centre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong Centre hosted the VAAA Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the original cinder track.

1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships, which for the first time attracted a major sponsorship from The Weekly Times.

May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated in law as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International standard 8 lane track.

1995 Barwon River flooded Landy Field on Melbourne Cup day to such a level there was 6 inches (150mm) of water in the WJP Wood Pavilion.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League (A Grade) to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships under a different AV management structure, where AV received and processed all entries, the Centre providing the venue and the finances being distributed differently.
The first Ron Clarke Classic is held on 17 December with World 40+ 1 hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Moneghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter passes away.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

2008 Geelong hosts the National and All schools cross country championships at Eastern Park 23-25 August.
The fourth and final (under this name) edition of the Ron Clarke Classic was conducted on 22 November.

2009 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (24-26 January) and the Australian Masters Games (21-25 February).

2010 Lighting installed at Landy Field in March

2012 The Victorian Road Relay Championships held at Geelong in August. The first time this event has been held outside of Melbourne.
A 50th anniversary dinner held at Dromoland House on 7 December attended by 140 people including AV President, Ian Jones. Richard Lawysz, Gabrielle Blythe and Richard Colman all spoke of their time at Geelong and in athletics.

2013 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (26-28 January)
Geelong hosts the Australian Masters Games in October.
Life Member and former Geelong Officials Club President, Wes Marshman passes away.

2014, Life Member Jack Darcy passes away.

2015, New hammer cage installed and new equipment shed erected at Landy Field.

2016, Geelong Athletics hosts the 2016 Victorian Country championships(22-24January).

2017, Life Member Ron Palmer passes away.
Chilwell celebrates its 50th Anniversary.

2017 John Landy Field Management Committee disbanded , management of Landy Field directly by City of Greater Geelong, John Landy Field Advisory Committee established.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2018-19

After returning to the Board after a season's absence, the same themes and issues still exist.

- (i) board vacancies.
- (ii) shield competition.
- (iii) update equipment and venue.

Shield consisting of 12 rounds at Landy Field commenced on Sat 6 Oct18 and was based on the AV Shield 2 programme cycle, culminating in the Shield Final at Albert Park on Sunday 23Feb19. Shield was again conducted as twilight meets on Saturday evenings in Jan19.

AV have introduced the online entry system for shield competition, with most athletes having done so, however, some still persist in not doing so.

Many athletes achieved success at the Allschools in Cairns as well as the combined Nationals in Sydney.

We welcomed Marila Kozdra who fulfilled the strategic role of Secretary this season to undertake the duties of this important position. Her enthusiasm to keep everyone up to date through social media was appreciated, as well as updating and making it "live" the Geelong Athletics web site however, we still collectively have difficulty in filling sub committees.

I thank sincerely those who volunteered to "make it happen" and their input to improving athletics in Geelong. There are those "behind the scenes" in an unofficial capacity who undertake various tasks to assist the board in providing competition for our athletes. And the number of such volunteers is diminishing putting undue and unwarranted pressure on them to provide what the athletes want.

There will be vacancies on the Board at the end of this 2018-19 season. There seems to be a reticence to be involved and leave to others "to make it happen". I've said this previously, well it's time for a generational change and maybe a realisation of and appreciation of what is actually required to "make it happen".

We still require more officials weekly to manage the conduct of the sport. We have had instances of athletes missing out on qualifiers or records. We are reliant on club helpers to put on events, yet athletes just want more.

The number of people willing to give of their time during the season and on Saturday afternoons is diminishing even further, thus putting extra burden on those who are left and still involved. I repeat *again*, to use the cliché, "many hands make light work" cannot be overstated.

We encourage all to becoming a qualified and registered official gives all of us the opportunity to be involved "in the action" and also assist in improving the presentation of events.

We congratulate our international representatives, Damien Birkinhead and Marty Jackson at the Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast and Christian Davis, Mia Gross and Harvey Murrant at the World Junior Championships in Finland.

Also our senior officials, Lorraine Sawyer and Pauline Zuccolin who officiated at the Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast.

We also congratulate Geoff Marshman on his AV Outstanding Achievement Regional Service Award and also Alison Reed, Athletics Victoria Geelong Region Official of the Year for 2018-19.

We encourage all club helpers to increase their knowledge through the Athletics Australia web site on line learning and then put it into practice at shield competition.

We need to consider the style of competition, support and expansion of coaching programmes and training and increased participation of officials, marketing and promotion and use of the media.

Our ongoing thanks to Mary and Geoff McDonald, for their continued management and support of the Twilight Trot(23 years strong now!) series in summer, a most rewarding event for all concerned, health and social benefits for participants and financially for Geelong Athletics. They are both stepping down so we look to the athletic community to keep this important event on the Geelong running calendar ongoing.

We need to cater for all our athletes, the vast range of talent requiring a vast range of needs to support their respective athletic careers, not to mention promotion of the sport itself. How do we keep the elite athletes competing at the local level?

We need to offer more via the clubs and coaching programmes in order to encourage more Little Athletes to continue in the sport at senior level. We need to continue to bridge that perceived great divide, which is slowly narrowing between Little Athletics and Seniors by being interactive and cross promotion.

As well as the official Little Athletics "Come and Try Days", we basically extended an open invitation for them to come any week.

We need to dispel the myth that "senior athletics" is only for the elite. You can do the sport for enjoyment's sake itself. A more equitable balance of numbers would no doubt assist both organisations.

The Geelong Centre total athletic registrations continue to remain about the same, yet the clubs, through their endeavours, attracted 62 new athletes this season. We need to implement measures to retain and nurture those athletes to remain in the sport.

At the 2019 Victorian Country Championships conducted in Mia Gross(Deakin) was awarded the Australia Day medal for her outstanding ,performances and Nyah Brown (Geelong Guild) the Stuart Hunter memorial shield.



TREASURER'S REPORT 2018-19

The financial standing of Geelong Athletics (GA) is sound.

Our major sources of income are Twilight Trot and schools equipment hire.

Twilight Trot made a profit of \$1,604.10 for 2018-19, a cumulative surplus of \$34,830.18.

Athletics Victoria has reimbursed Geelong Athletics(GA) for venue hire, equipment, officials and trophies for \$9,500 in 2017-18 and has done so for 2018-19 for \$10,000.(received after 1Apr19).

Due to a misunderstanding by COGG of dates and rental rates, there was delay in GA paying for 2018-19 track hire as well as rental. We have now paid track hire for summer season 2018-19, \$4,800 (May19) and \$970.20(April19) for rental.

We received backpay from City of Greater Geelong (COGG)for schools equipment hire in Dec18 of \$8,470, dating back to mid 2017.

Schools equipment hire procedure has been refined in conjunction with Council so that we are now receiving payments in a reasonably timely manner direct form the schools.

So far this calendar year to 31Mar19, we have had 17 schools bookings so far, with only 1 school still to pay, having received \$4,500. Note, we have already received bookings up to Sep19 and have received in payments post 1Apr19 of \$2,800.

In April19, GA was eligible for a grant from Grill'd of \$100.(still to be received).

We were also successful in applying for a grant from AV of \$3,000 for two new laptops. However, we did incur an additional cost of \$563.39 in this transaction due to the cost of higher capacity laptops.

We need to note that in January 2020, we will be hosting the Country Championships, expenditure will be required to ensure all our equipment and supporting infrastructure is up to date.

For summer competition, we received monies from trialling athletes, \$380.

In summary for 2018-19:

Schools equipment hire - \$260

Grill'd - \$100

Monies owed by Geelong Athletics:

Schools co-ordinator - \$700(estimate)

Winter cross country season 2018:

As read in the statement, only three items passed through the GA accounts, \$200 anonymous donation, purchase of trophies \$200 and \$1,309 for uniforms in 2018-19.

The major income stream for XCR is the Bellarine Rail Trail run in August, which funds other outgoings for the XCR.

Eija Heikkila who took photos of the runners and Marila Kozdra for placing them on Geelong Athletics Facebook page.

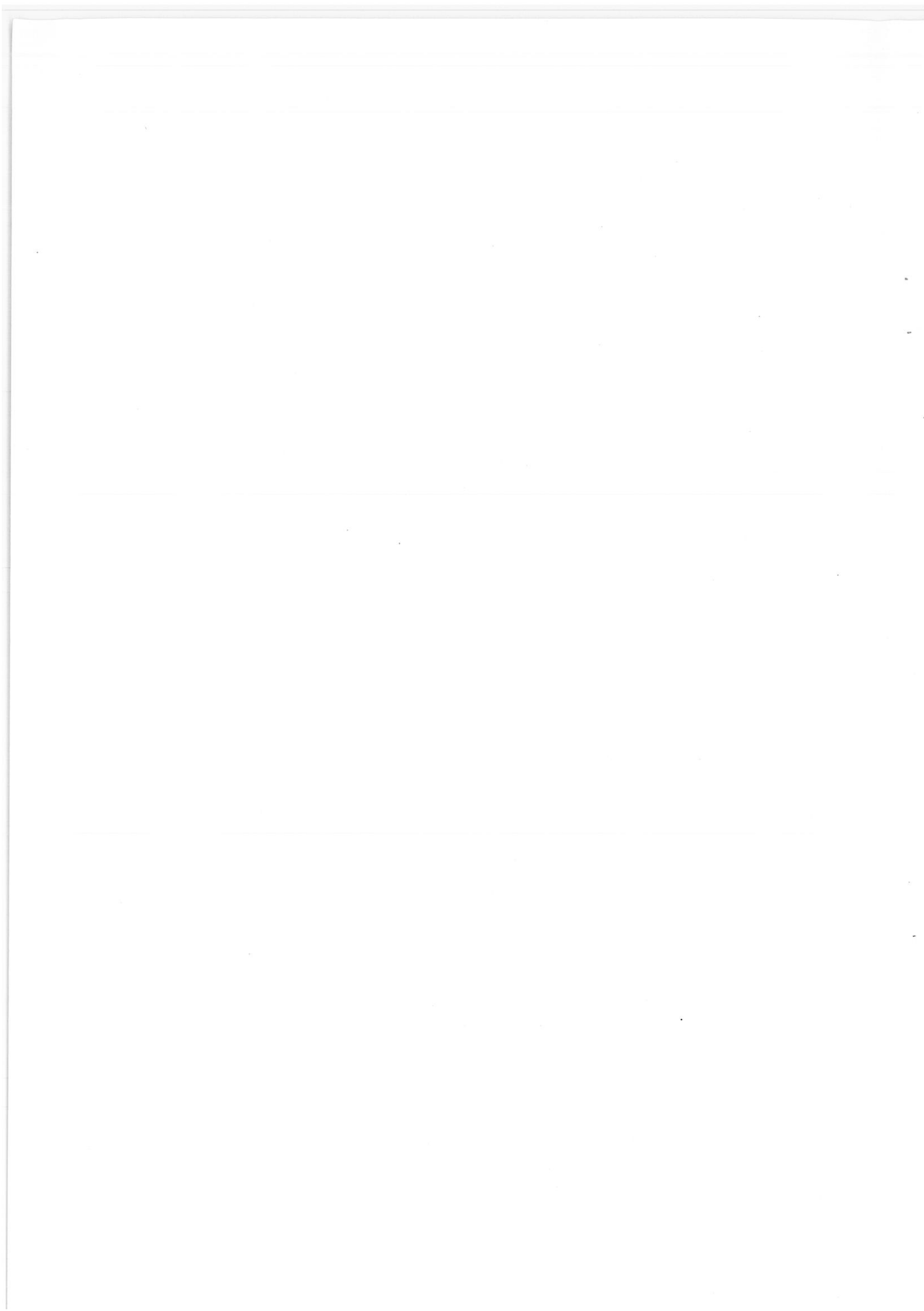
Geoff and I, have thoroughly enjoyed our time and involvement in running the Twilight Trot for the past 23 years, but the time has now come for us to retire.
