HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association (VAAA) with our first State champions being W.S. Jones (hammer) and J.D. McRae (pole vault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the VAAA 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. This year saw the continuation of State events being held in Geelong with the Athletics Victoria Road Relay Championships being held at the Belmont Criterium on 11 August 2012.

In December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) was founded with Geelong women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

In 1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan and John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964 –1966 saw the Geelong Centre assist in the formation of the Geelong Little Athletics Centre, the number 1 centre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong Centre hosted the VAAA Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the original cinder track.

1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships, which for the first time attracted a major sponsorship from The Weekly Times.

May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated in law as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International standard 8 lane track.

1995 Barwon River flooded Landy Field on Melbourne Cup day to such a level there was 6 inches(150mm) of water in the WJP Wood Pavilion.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League (A Grade) to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships under a different AV management structure, where AV received and processed all entries, the Centre providing the venue and the finances being distributed differently.

2005 The first Ron Clarke Classic is held on 17 December with World 40+ 1 hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Moneghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter passes away.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

2008 Geelong hosts the National and All schools cross country championships at Eastern Park 23-25 August.

2008 The fourth and final (under this name) edition of the Ron Clarke Classic was conducted on 22 November.

2009 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (24-26 January) and the Australian Masters Games (21-25 February).

2010 Lighting installed at Landy Field in March

2012 The Victorian Road Relay Championships held at Geelong in August. The first time this event has been held outside of Melbourne.

2012 A 50th anniversary dinner held at Dromoland House on 7 December attended by 140 people including AV President, Ian Jones. Richard Lawysz, Gabrielle Blythe and Richard Colman all spoke of their time at Geelong and in athletics.

2013 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (26-28 January)

2013 Life Member and former Geelong Officials Club President, Wes Marshman passes away.

2013 Geelong hosts the Australian Masters athletics championships(Oct13)

2014 Life Member Jack Darcy passes away.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2013-14

Much of my report is just a regurgitation of previous reports, which only highlights the recurrent issues:

- (i) board vacancies.
- (ii) shield competition.
- (iii) update equipment and venue.

Shield at Landy Field had a delayed start till after the Australian Masters Games and commenced on Sat 19 Oct13 and was based on the AV Shield 2 programme cycle, culminating in the Shield Final at Albert Park on Saturday 12 April, 2014. Shield was trialled as night meets on Saturday nights with some success and was cancelled on Sat 8Feb14 due to the extreme heat forecast. It was not rescheduled.

Athletes took up the challenge to represent Geelong at the Shield Final on 12Apr14. However, the number of athletes representing Geelong did fall away due to their other commitments with such a late date which encroaches into the winter sports(football/netball) period.

I thank Ian Blanchonette as well as the team managers for following up and encouraging athletes to participate.

Many athletes achieved success at the Allschools in Townsville as well as the Nationals in Sydney and Melbourne.

We warmly welcomed Sally Hockey to the Secretary's position and appreciated her enthusiasm in the role and support to other portfolio managers. However, we AGAIN did not have a Summer Portfolio Manager this season which only puts pressure on others to fulfill the responsibilities of this important position. Nevertheless, summer competition happened as usual and I surmise no one was the wiser or cared, as long as it happened. Also no portfolio managers for Publicity, Marketing and an Acting Treasurer as well A/ Winter portfolio manager, thanks to Neil Whitmore for him taking on these roles even reluctantly in the absence of anyone willing to take on these roles. Neil is definitively vacating the Board at the end of this season.

I again thank those who volunteered to "make it happen" and their input to improving athletics in Geelong.

However, we still require more interest in filling sub committee positions in order to spread the work load as well as open up to more ideas.

We still require more officials weekly to manage the conduct of the sport.

The number of people willing to give of their time during the season and on Saturday afternoons is diminishing even further, thus putting extra burden on those who are still involved. I repeat *again*, to use the cliché, "many hands make light work" cannot be overstated.

We encourage all to becoming a qualified and registered official gives all of us the opportunity to be involved "in the action" and also assist in improving the presentation of events. Officials courses were arranged in Geelong in Sep13. But how many actually put into practice what they had learnt?

A reminder, the Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast will be conducted on 4-15 April, 2018. In athletic terms not that far away. So, those who would look to being considered for involvement as an official, now is the time to get started!

From an officials perspective, there will now be Australian Athletics Officials with one training and education scheme to cover both Little Athletics and Senior competitions. This approach will also be introduced at Victorian state level.

Some matters to consider:

The style of competition, the make up and number of clubs, state and national events, infrastructure(facilities), management procedures and methods and their implementation, support and expansion of coaching programmes and training and increased participation of officials, marketing and promotion and use of the media.

The Geelong cross country teams achieved success, thanks primarily to Brett Coleman who had overcome some horrific accident injuries.

Geelong championships were conducted early in the season Fri 9Nov13 and Sat 7Dec13.

The Cup Competition was cancelled on Sat 15Mar14 due to the lack of officials to actually run the meet.

We need to cater for all our athletes, the vast range of talent requiring a vast range of needs to support their respective athletic careers, not to mention promotion of the sport itself. How do we keep the elite athletes competing at the local level?

We congratulate Sam Reiser(DKU) and Joel Baden(ex CHI) on their selection for the World Junior Championships in Eugene in July14 as well as Richard Colman(CHI) and Damien Birkinhead(COR) selected for the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow in July14 NS Jess Gulli(DKU) World Relay Championships in the Bahamas May14.

We need to offer more via the clubs and coaching programmes in order to encourage more Little Athletes to continue in the sport at senior level. We need to continue to bridge that perceived great divide, which is slowly narrowing between Little Athletics and Seniors by being interactive and cross promotion.

We need to dispel the myth that "senior athletics" is only for the elite. You can do the sport for enjoyment's sake itself. A more equitable balance of numbers would no doubt assist both organisations.

The Geelong Centre continues to be a leader in providing athletic competition for Athletes With a Disability(AWD), being totally integrated within the mainstream athletic programme as well as our Masters athletes.

The Geelong Centre total athletic registrations continue to remain about the same, yet the clubs, through their endeavours, attracted 56 new athletes this season. We need to implement measures to retain and nurture those athletes to remain in the sport.

At the 2014 Victorian Country Championships at Ballarat, Chilwell won "back to back Margaret Saunders Cup, and Ned Weatherley(Chilwell) was awarded the Joyce Lockyer Shield who was a multi gold medallist.

The annual presentation at Queens Park Golf Club on Fri 28 Mar14 was a success.

The Summer Meeting has been held and set the course for next season.

Financially, the Geelong Centre is continuing to run a steady course.

It has been another challenging season, which one isn't? I especially thank Geoff McDonald(2013) and Mary Clough(2014) for their input on the schools side and further our Portfolio Managers and sub committees for their dedication to the sport and acknowledge and applaud their contributions and their personal support during the season. Specifically, our thanks to our hard working Technical Manager Alan Hawkins and Vice President Lou Mirarchi for their support at Shield.

We have vacancies on the Board, as mentioned above, and we thank Neil Whitmore for him continuing as the acting Treasurer and Winter Portfolio Manager.

I continue to challenge the clubs and give them the opportunity to fill vacancies on the Board and the sub committees, we do not want Geelong Athletics to become stale.

Finally, I thank and acknowledge all the families, officials and club administrators who give of their time so generously to provide the athletes the opportunity to participate in their chosen sport. I trust their appreciation is reciprocated.

Treasurers Report 2013-14.

The financial position of the Centre increased by \$11,884.05 over the year. In 2012-13, we were well placed for equipment and equipment purchases weren't necessary. This changed in the current year as a total amount of \$10,450-94 was spent. The major item of equipment was an EDM purchased with the assistance of AV. As can be seen, the necessity to purchase equipment varies from season to season. Unfortunately equipment is subject to wear and tear and continual repair and replacement is required.

I am pleased to report that the Centre is in a very healthy financial position and that all expected expenses are able to be covered.

The Centre has the benefit of raising funds by hiring our equipment to many local Geelong and District secondary schools on their athletic carnival days and has been very successful in generating funds totaling \$5,480.00 this financial year plus a further amount of \$3,150- was received for equipment hire during the Masters Games. This is an important part of the Centre's funding, and without this source of funds, other fund raising activities would be required. Due to rising costs, the hiring charges were increased from 1st January 2014. As a result, with the purchase of upgraded equipment we were able to hire higher quality equipment to the schools. We are most appreciative of the time devoted by Centre members both on the school sports days and at other times in organizing the equipment for the schools at their sport's Carnivals.

Annual Club Levies raised a total of \$2,250- this financial year. All Clubs have paid their levies and \$690- from 2012-13 is included in the current total. Therefore the amount received in levies is similar to the previous year.

No doubt equipment will need replacement for next season and as the level of sophistication moves onward the cost increases accordingly. It is hoped that this will improve the efficiency in providing performance results and hasten up the weekly programs.

Summer Competition. CR \$16440.63 (CR \$18,128.74) Decrease \$1,688.11

The ledger position decreased due to decreased competition revenue plus an overall increase in costs.

AV paid an amount of \$2,490- to our Shield Officials for their services in 2012-13 that wasn't received until the commencement of the next season. This practice wasn't continued this Track Season conducted in 2013-14.

On the income side, competition fees decreased by \$2,771-. We also received \$1,308- for advertising signage at the venue. There has been a drop off interest in this advertising from businesses, as the Geelong economy has suffered a downturn.

On the expenditure side, an amount of \$6,600- was paid to JLFMC for hire of Landy Field during the Track Season. Of this of this amount, \$1,200- relates to Track Hire for 2012-13.

As per the previous season, the track Season awards presentation evening is very cost effective as the attendees paid for their own meal at the event, and there was no venue charge at the Queens Park Golf Club. Our only expense for this function is that of trophies. The cost of trophies was up by \$170.32 as our previous supplier whose trophy prices were below market rates retired from business and we therefore purchased from another retailer.

Twilight Trot CRS 23,7528.45 (CR \$21,114.70-) Increase \$2,463.75.
Winter Cross Country. CR \$16,017.18 (CR \$15,075.63 Increase \$ 941.55

The Twilight Trot had another successful season with an excellent contribution of income to our funds by way of competition fees.

Both of these above competitions continue to contribute to the overall funds of the Centre, and expenses are minimized by conducting the competitions at Public parks etc. in various locations in and around Geelong, as has been the case for many seasons. The weekly runs are used by both regular and social runners to increase/ maintain their fitness and has introduced many athletes to our Centre.

Country Championships CR \$17,019.52 (Cr\$6,930.43) Increase \$10,089.09

The above Championships were conducted at our own Centre in 2012-13. The reimbursement and profit contribution from AV of \$10,089.09 for this event was received in 2013-14 hence the large increased balance in this ledger.

We are most appreciative of AV in providing these funds and also performing some of the Administrative duties.

Geelong Championships CR \$4,924.20 (CR\$3,844-00) Decrease \$1080.20

Entries in the Championships was similar to the previous year being only down by \$41-.

It was necessary to purchase additional Gold and Silver medals to replenish our stock levels, the cost of which was \$1,949.20. In the future, Championship entry fees will reimburse the cost of these medals.

Centre Teams Winter State League Cross Country. DR\$ 5008.29 (Dr \$2,219.46) Increase \$2,788.83.

This season recorded a good result with an increase of \$2,788.83. This is due largely by the sponsorship monies of \$3,950- received in this financial year from one of our sponsors, The Running Company Geelong. It should be noted that \$1,950- of this sponsorship relates to 2014-15 XC year.

We are most appreciative of our excellent sponsors in The Running Company Geelong, Steigen Pty Ltd and Steampocket Catering who assist in making this competition so successful.

It is important to have sponsorship support as the entry fees to AV for their events are high in comparison to entry fees for Geelong Athletics events. Funds from the sale of regional uniforms will assist in the funding of the regional XC teams ledger in the future.

Entry fee expenses for XC events; paid to AV totaled \$1,170-.

It is also important to note the importance and reliance on our Officials and non-competing parents who travel to events mainly to Melbourne to assist in conducting and officiating at the XC events during the season.

Centre Teams Summer Dr \$1.435- (\$1.435-)

There were no entries to this ledger this year.

A.V. Winter XC Championships CR\$2,063- (\$2,063-00)

There was no change to this ledger.

50th Anniversary Dr \$1,079.39 (\$1,079.39)

There were no further entries to this ledger.

There were no debts owing by the Centre as at 31st March 2014.

It will be the main objective to continue to fund the facilities to conduct a high standard of competition to our Club athletes and replace damaged and worn out equipment as required and to invest in new technology to maintain standards and improve Geelong Athletics. There's always additional equipment to purchase to improve Geelong Athletics for the officials and athletes.

Due to several positions being vacant, the Board has had to assume additional positions and responsibilities to spread the load and ensure that Geelong Athletics functioned efficiently to cater for the needs of all athletes. This isn't ideal and we need an even spread to ensure that Geelong Athletics functions efficiently with every position being filled. After all, the Centre conducts the sport of Athletics and Cross Country for the benefit of all athletes.

After a term of 5 years, for a number of reasons I won't be continuing as Treasurer for next season. I would like to thank the President and Board Members, the Executive members of all Geelong Athletic Clubs, athletes and parents for their assistance whilst I have been the treasurer.

Shield at Landy Field had a delayed start commencing on Sat 19 Oct13 after the Masters Games and was based on being integrated into the AV Shield 2 programme cycle, culminating in the late Shield Final at Albert Park on Saturday 12 April, 2014.

Shield was conducted on a Friday night in Nov13 with limited success, weather not really helping with attendance.

Shield on Sat 8Feb14 was cancelled due to the extreme heat.

The long, drawn out season did not sit well with many athletes, starting late October13 and finishing in April14 with the shield final, not to mention the lack of continuity of the shield calendar.

We introduced invitation throws events to supplement the existing programmes.

The scheduled night shield meets had reasonable success so could be persevered with. We do have lights!!

However, the number of athletes representing Geelong in the shield final did fall away due to their other commitments as it was conducted so late.

I thank Ian Blanchonette especially for following up and encouraging athletes to participate as well as the respective age group managers who kindly offered their time and efforts to support our Geelong athletes.

AV continued to conduct a series of specialist event groups to encourage better athletes the competition they require to achieve qualifying performances. Geelong did not host an AV specialist event group meet this summer season.

On Sat 21Dec13 we conducted the 10k/pole vault event at the end of the Geelong multis which we conducted on this week end. Thanks to the officials who generously gave their time to support the athletes. We are looking to again conduct a similar week end on Sat/Sun 20-21Dec14.

Many athletes achieved success at the Allschools in Townsville as well as the Nationals in Sydney and Melbourne.

We did not have a Summer Portfolio Manager AGAIN this season which only puts pressure on others to fulfill the responsibilities of this position.

Geelong championships before Christmas on Fri 9 Nov & Sat 7Dec13 were conducted however, participation numbers were down.

The Cup Competition was cancelled due to the lack of officials on Sat 15Mar14.

We need to review the conduct of the 10,000metres and 1 hour runs which were held in conjunction with the Masters on two Wednesday nights. We will require assistance with photo finish and shield results systems next summer season.

Thanks to all the officials and club helpers who assisted to provide the shield programmes during the season.

At the 2014 Victorian Country Championships at Ballarat, Chilwell won the Margaret Saunders Country Cup Ned Weatherley(Chilwell) who was also a multiple gold medallist at the Nationals and state championships, was awarded the Joyce Lockyer Memorial Shield. Ned has also been selected for the Youth Olympics to be conducted in China later this year.

Athletics Victoria has announced the venues for the country championships for the next 5 years, Geelong to be hosts in January, 2016 with Bendigo to do so in January, 2015.

We congratulate Damien Birkinhead and Richard Colman on their selection to compete in the Commonwealth Games in Glasgow as well as Sam Reiser on his selection for the world junior championships in Eugene Oregon.

Jess Gulli has been named in the 4x400m relay team to contest the world relay championships in the Bahamas in late May14(subject to acceptance by IAAF).

The annual presentation night at Queens Park Golf Club on Fri 28 Mar14 was a success, especially noticeable the younger athletes in attendance.

We now await advice from AA/AV re their proposed calendars so as to consolidate ours.

Twilight Trot Report 2013 – 2014

This was the 23rd season of the Twilight Trot and I believe it was Mary and my 16th year in organising the Trot.

It was also I believe our most successful season in regards to participation and income.

A nett profit of \$2659.05 was achieved. (2012/13 - \$2466.80) and we averaged 65 participants per run (2012/2013 – 60). The Trot is a great revenue raiser for Geelong Athletics as very little expense is incurred.

The season commenced on 28 October 2013 and concluded on 3 March 2014. A total of 16 runs.

The weather was very favourable throughout the season and once again we attracted a large number of participants prior to Xmas with a record high for the Trot of 84 runners. In general the Trot attracted 65 – 70 participants per run. Unlike other years following Xmas when numbers dramatically decreased, this year participation numbers increased with a large increase in juniors. On a number of occasions more than 20 juniors attended especially after "Introduce a Friend" was introduced.

In order to publicise the Trot I sent out emails to all participants involved in 2012/13 season, and handed out flyers at various Fun Runs. I also organised for the Geelong Advertiser to once again attend the Trot on our first run and as a result we had photos in the Advertiser and also one in the Geelong News. This is a great advertisement for the Trot as our first run was down on numbers (44 in fact being the poorest attendance) from previous seasons but picked up immediately to 66 following the newspaper photos and articles.

McDonald & Co Real Estate continued their sponsorship of the Trot. Brad Seller a director of the company participated in each run and it was great to see that his attendance was rewarded by an end of season award in his age category.

Each week Nadine Seller prepared a hamper of various food products and other items and the hamper along with 2 (McDonald & Co) coffee cups were handed out as spot prizes.

Brad each week presented the various spot prizes to the participants.

McDonald & Co will be continuing their sponsorship of the Trot for the 2014/2015 season. Thank you to Brad Seller, Samantha Davison and Tanya Di Loreto the Directors for their continuing support.

Participation

Technical report 2013/14 season

This year again has presented with challenges getting maintenance done in a timely manner at Landy Field.

We have been able to get the original running rail re fitted by yours truly We have increasing the number of supports to the rail which has improved its stability as thus far has been problem free since being refitted to the track.

The hammer cage with its history of problems has seen some refurbishment with a new net and extensions to the front gates to increase the safety zones to the infield set up. It would be good to see the Mondo cage at the other end of the infield refurbished to be a second hammer /discus cage as at some point in time the other cage will need repairs again.

Two new long jump pit covers have been ordered by JLFMC and are awaiting delivery.

Wear to the track surface on the javelin run up, high jump take off and 100 m start is to be repaired this year.

Earlier this year saw some new equipment We have been able to obtain a second-hand EDM (Electronic Distance Measuring device for measuring throws with the assistance from AV and a contribution from Geelong Athletics. This is a great addition to our equipment and aid to our officials. All of our officials have been keen to be trained on its use and set up and undoubtedly they have become more familiar and it has helped to keep events running on time.

As we hire equipment out to school over the autumn/winter it was decided to upgrade the equipment and replace anything that was beyond its use by date. We have been able to use equipment from the seniors and replenish with new equipment or new equipment we have had on hand. We did have to buy 9 new javelins and starting blocks this year. I would like to thank Mary Clough for taking on the role of caretaker and putting out the equipment when schools are down at Landy Field.

We have had both sets of high jump bags recovered with new mesh tops and will help to extend their life. As with all equipment there are still on-going repairs to be done to the pole vault area, steeple hurdles and high jump covers.

Finally I would like to invite anybody that is interested in being the technical manager at some stage in the future to come down as see what is involved with the role.
