## HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association (VAAA) with our first State champions being W.S. Jones (hammer) and J.D. McRae (pole vault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the VAAA 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. In 2012, the Athletics Victoria Road Relay Championships being held at the Belmont Criterium on 11 August 12.

December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) was founded with Geelong women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan and John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964 –1966 saw the Geelong Centre assist in the formation of the Geelong Little Athletics Centre, the number 1 centre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong Centre hosted the VAAA Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the original cinder track.

1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships, which for the first time attracted a major sponsorship from The Weekly Times.

May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated in law as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International standard 8 lane track.

1995 Barwon River flooded Landy Field on Melbourne Cup day to such a level there was 6 inches (150mm) of water in the WJP Wood Pavilion.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League (A Grade) to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships under a different AV management structure, where AV received and processed all entries, the Centre providing the venue and the finances being distributed differently. The first Ron Clarke Classic is held on 17 December with World 40+ 1 hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Moneghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter passes away.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

2008 Geelong hosts the National and All schools cross country championships at Eastern Park 23-25 August. The fourth and final (under this name) edition of the Ron Clarke Classic was conducted on 22 November.

2009 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (24-26 January) and the Australian Masters Games (21-25 February).

2010 Lighting installed at Landy Field in March.

2012 The Victorian Road Relay Championships held at Geelong in August. The first time this event has been held outside of Melbourne. A 50th anniversary dinner held at Dromoland House on 7 December attended by 140 people including AV President, Ian Jones. Richard Lawysz, Gabrielle Blythe and Richard Colman all spoke of their time at Geelong and in athletics.

2013 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (26-28 January). Geelong hosts the Australian Masters Games in October. Life Member and former Geelong Officials Club President, Wes Marshman passes away.

2014 Life Member Jack Darcy passes away.

2015 New hammer cage installed and new equipment shed erected at Landy Field.

2016 Geelong Athletics hosts the 2016 Victorian Country championships (22-24 January).

2017 Life Member Ron Palmer passes away. Chilwell celebrates its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. John Landy Field Management Committee disbanded, Landy Field directly managed by City of Greater Geelong, John Landy Field Advisory Committee established.

2018 Life Member Bob Fossey passes away.

2019 Life Member Stuart Robley passes away.

2020 Geelong hosts the 2020 Victorian Country championships (25-27 January). Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, winter season cancelled and summer season severely curtailed with late start (Nov20) and limited events, resuming “normal” competition in Jan 2021 Twilight Trot and The Steigen Spectacular as well as schools’ athletics days also cancelled.

2021 City of Greater Geelong announce in their 2021-22 budget, Landy Field refurbishment and pavilion upgrade - \$400,000 in 2021-22, \$6 million over three years, 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of first meet held at Landy Field.

2022 Warrnambool based club, Athletics South West “Turbines”, affiliates with Geelong Athletics Inc. John Landy passes away 24<sup>th</sup> February. Ian Chesterman, former Geelong Guild Athlete, elected President of the Australian Olympic Committee. Life Member Pat Agg passes away 9<sup>th</sup> August. October sees Landy Field flooded twice despite the Barwon River not breaching the banks – issue related to the incorrect use of the flood valves by City of Greater Geelong.

2023 Despite having two near season-ending flooding events Geelong hosts the 2023 Victorian Country Championships as well as the Mens Discus Throw event as part of the Maurie Plant event, a World Athletics Continental Tour Gold Meet and sees a new New Zealand record claimed.

## COMMITTEE REPORT 2022-23

Normally this would be the President's Report but with there being no President this year the report has been prepared by the Committee of Geelong Athletics (GA).

Despite the challenges this year with flood events it has been a very successful season.

Just as we were commencing the season, flooding at Landy Field put a pause on the season. The flooding event, not via the river but through the storm water drains, highlighted the need for greater facilities maintenance understanding by the City of Greater Geelong (CoGG). A lack of understanding on how the knife valve and drainage systems saw over 100,000 m<sup>3</sup> flood the infield and track. Thankfully the CoGG teams rallied and worked with contractors, GA and GLAC to get the facilities ready in under a week. Sadly the valves, which had remained closed during cleaning, were not reopened in time for the next rain event which saw the infield and throw's rings flooded again.

GA, GLAC and CoGG have worked hard on the relationship between the respective stakeholders and with a dedicated venue manager now at CoGG – our maintenance program has significantly improved.

The winter and summer competition seasons have been very well documented in the respective reports. We thank the respective portfolio managers and their teams for ensuring both seasons went very well.

Our financial results for the season were very strong thanks to a resumption of usual business, the hosting of the Victorian Country Athletics Championships (VCAC) and a series of successful grant applications. The Board has identified over \$50k of capital items which it would like to purchase in the coming season the most significant of which being a new photo finish camera (est. \$25k). We also take this opportunity to thank our outgoing Treasurer, Reagan, for his contributions to the health of our financial position and wish him all the very best.

Unfortunately, the work undertaken to update our Rules and By Laws was unable to be completed due to a lack of sufficient inputs from all clubs despite consultation opportunities. This is significant piece of work which still requires completion.

Geelong Athletics has received praise and acknowledgement for the quality and efficiency of the programs it offers. Our officials are highly regarded for their friendliness and efficiency and often sort out for specialty meets. Our program and venue is extremely popular for the quality of facilities, vista and welcoming community – a credit to all.

Work on the Facility Improvement plans to redevelop Landy Field had been progressing with significant time inputs by the stakeholders (GA & GLAC) and the team at CoGG. Disappointingly we were advised in late April 2023, that the Council was under significant financial pressures and that this project (and a number of other capital projects) would be placed on hold until the financial shortfalls could be funded from State or Federal governments. We will continue to update our members if there is any change in the status of this project.

Our more immediate concern are the repairs required to the track post flooding and the looming expiry of our World Athletics certification of our track. This has been escalated to Council and we are seeking confirmation if the necessary funding has been approved to replace the track as part of the Council's asset renewal program.

Our XCR team performed well during the winter of 2022 and the Board committed to trying to grow participation in this area. Matt Gunther has worked hard promoting this area of competition and we have seen a substantial increase in numbers for the 2023 winter season already.

As noted in our Summer report, Geelong Athletics hosted a number of events over and above our AVSL season including the very successful 2023 Steigen Victorian Country Championships. This is a highlight on the calendar for many athletes and our community rose to the occasion. Our clubs stepped up in the running of this event with many “back-of-house” jobs needing volunteers over and above the championship official duties – to those who helped – many thanks. We will be working with AV and the other regional centres to determine where these championships might be held over the next 5 years as the timing of the Commonwealth Games impacting the normal sequence of hosting rotations.

Following the success of hosting the men’s discus throw as part of the Maurie Plant meet, we have been asked, by interstate coaches and athletes, to run some winter throws competitions to assist athletes in their preparations for various upcoming World Championships. Two meets have been scheduled for June 2023.

Our affiliate clubs do not provide direct financial contributions to Geelong Athletics so the provision of equipment to secondary schools is essential to funding the operating costs relating to our venue rental, insurances, equipment replacements, awards etc. Instrumental to this service has been the efforts of Kelly and Tyler Costin who are the “face” of athletics for our schools community. They have been stellar in their efforts at ensuring the right equipment is there for each booking and building relationships with the schools. We thank them also for their dedication to this task.

We would be remiss to not acknowledge our major sponsors this year and would like to thank the following for their sponsorships which have been both monetary and in kind – Steigen, The Running Company Geelong, Athletics Victoria, City of Greater Geelong, Barwon Sports Physiotherapy, Norwood products, Rotary Club of Ocean Grove, Barwon Water, The Injury Clinic and Compton Green.

Geelong Athletics exists to promote and facilitate athletics competition in the region and relies on the support of volunteers. Each year we call for help and the number of hands that go up in the air seem to be fewer and fewer. We would urge you all to think about offering a few hours each month or of a weekend to make the work load a little bit lighter for all.

Finally, we would like to thank and acknowledge all Geelong Athletics community who give of their time and support our programs. We wish everyone all the best for the season to come.

## SECRETARYS REPORT 2022-23

This season has once again been too few wearing too many hats and I would strongly urge anyone with any desire to contribute to the ongoing operations of Geelong Athletics to put their hand up to volunteer in some capacity. We have vacancies on the Board and a need for volunteers to train to become officials to enable our sport to continue. If you are time poor – please sign up to be a club helper and make the life of your club’s administrator a lot easier.

Much time has been dedicated this season to dealing with the fallout and recovery of our two flood events at Landy Field included an ongoing, as yet, unresolved insurance claim for damage.

We have been busy organizing and hosting the 2023 Steigen Victorian Country Athletics Championships (2023VCAC) as well as finding grants to finance not only our normal operating expenses but the ongoing cost of replacing and upgrading our equipment assets.

This season saw a transfer of responsibilities in internal management of Landy Field to the CoGG Leisure and Recreation team. We met with this team regularly throughout the season and have managed to build a far better understanding, by the CoGG’s team, of our facility issues as well as our maintenance and bookings issues.

Unfortunately, our attempts last season to do a major update the Rules and By Laws to reflect the currency of our operations did not receive sufficient support which was disappointing given the effort and consultation that had been undertaken. Minor updates will now be presented at periodic intervals at the relevant meetings.

On a personal note, I would like to thank Life Members Richard Lawysz and Anula Costa for their ongoing mentoring and support. If there is something you do not know or what to know – these are the people to seek out.

To my fellow Board members – thank you once again. Special thanks must go to Jonathan Burns for all his efforts to ensure we had all the right equipment at the right time to be able to host our season and the 2023VCAC. He has been incredibly creative and resourceful in developing and building special trolleys for our equipment to maximise the efficiency of our set up and pack ups for which all our officials will be eternally grateful. Other clubs and centres have expressed their envy of our equipment trolleys so we may need to register a patent!

To the Clubs, Officials, Club Helpers, Coaches and Athletes – congratulations on all your efforts this season. Hopefully next season we will be drama free and we can continue to build on our reputation as one of the best centres in the country.

## TREASURERS REPORT 2022-23

The net surplus for financial year 2022-23 was \$35,516.

The major income streams for this year included AVSL (\$9,000), school equipment hire (\$9,290), and the Country Championships (\$20,964). Overall, income has increased yet costs have remained consistent with previous years, this has led to an increase in surplus upon the previous year.

School equipment hire was largely uninterrupted this year. Invoices were sent out earlier than previous years to promote the Association's cashflow. Many schools paid the equipment hire fee in advance, resulting in some unearned income at year end. Overall, fees from this income stream were consistent with the previous year.

The 2023 Country Championships generated revenue from hosting fees (\$7,600), Steigen sponsorship (\$4,000), a City of Greater Geelong event grant (\$5,000), and canteen sales (\$4,364). The most notable expenses for the championships related to canteen supplies and catering for officials. The Association benefited from the assistance of club volunteers in the canteen which meant labor costs were non-existent. Overall, the surplus from the event amounted to \$15,386.

A significant effort was made by the Association's Secretary in applying for grants throughout the year. We were successful in obtaining a total of \$12,000 from three applications. These supported the running of the Country Championships and the purchase of equipment, including a new set of elite starting blocks. Furthermore, funding was received in response to costs expected to be incurred because of the Landy Field flood.

Despite continued efforts, we did not receive an insurance premium notice during the year. Regardless, a claim has been made relating to damage caused by the Landy Field floods. This matter is ongoing, and the outcome will be known in the 2023-24 financial year.

A new 5k/10k event was organised and run during the year. The surplus from this event amounted to \$519. The event received very positive feedback and is expected to be run again next year with the potential for an increase in entry fees.

2 years of Landy Field track hire were paid in the previous year. However, the City of Greater Geelong advised that the fees were incorrectly invoiced due to a COVID-19 fee waiver. A credit was subsequently received on the Association's account. As of 31 March 2023, a credit of \$1,410 was held with the council to be applied against future invoices.

The Association's cash position at 31 March 2023 was \$106,686. This is a significant increase upon the previous year. With the recent rise in interest rates, \$20,000 was placed in a 6-month term deposit in February 2023, earning a return of 3.05% per annum.

Overall, I believe FY23 has been successful in terms of financial performance.





## VALE – PATRICIA “PAT” AGG

Geelong Athletics was saddened by the passing of former Vice President and Life Member, Mrs Pat Agg.

Pat Agg became the matriarch of Geelong Athletics through not only her longevity in life but through her longevity in the administration of athletics; roles which included significant tenures as Geelong Guild Women’s Secretary, the Geelong Athletics Records Officer, Registrar, and initially as a representative for Geelong and then regionally on the Victorian Country Committee and as a highly proficient walk judge and wind gauge operator.

Patricia Joyce Rogan was born on 17 March 1924. She was one of a large family. Pat married Russell Agg in 1947. Pat’s sporting interests as a young woman included netball and running with the clubs associated with the Soldiers Woollen Mills, where she worked.

It was during 1964 when Pat was approached to help rejuvenate the flagging Geelong Guild Women’s Athletic Club, which had been originally formed in 1955. Pat’s eldest daughter Val, had been one of the athletes who attended the first day of the Saturday morning competition at Landy Field (later widely known as Little Athletics) in October 1964.

It was not long after this, in 1965, that Pat Agg (with great help from the late Frank Searby), became Secretary of the Geelong Guild Women’s Athletic Club, a voluntary position Pat would become synonymous with over the next three decades. Her office, the family home at Mundy Street in South Geelong, is just a stone’s throw from Landy Field.

All her children took up a sporting interest. Val and Gary in athletics; eldest son Rob played football and cricket and youngest daughter Jenny played netball and tennis.

With Val and Gary running each Saturday, Pat immersed herself in the sport she would love for years to come. Her first roles at Landy Field were as a track judge at the finish line and as the Officials Manager on the (former) Geelong Centre of the Victorian Women’s Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) Board of Management.

As an early trailblazer in women’s athletics in Geelong, Pat would recall one of her bleakest moments in athletics, years later. Whilst waiting to start a Guild women’s committee meeting one night in mid-1965, news came through that their fellow committee member and Commonwealth Games athlete, Joan Beretta, had gone missing on the Barwon River. Joan took to rowing as part of her training regime for her middle-distance running. Sadly, Joan’s body was recovered from the river some days later.

In 1974, Pat Agg and her friend Lauren Johns became the first two ladies to be awarded Life Membership of the Geelong Women’s Centre.

The following year in 1975, Pat was accorded the same honour of Life Membership from her club, Geelong Guild. This Life Membership certificate was proudly displayed in the lounge room of the family home at South Geelong.

After this first decade in athletics, Pat Agg advanced her athletic skills and knowledge. She was, by now, a Geelong Guild delegate to the VWAAA monthly Council meetings held in Melbourne. She would attend these meetings with fellow women officials in Pat Maxwell, Margaret Saunders (Chilwell) and Val Robley (Sacred Heart).

Concerned for athletics in Geelong and in the regional areas of Victoria, Pat was elected as the first Country Vice President of the VWAAA in 1970. She held this position until 1978 when her dear friend Margaret Saunders became Country Vice President.

At the same time, Pat was President of the Geelong Centre of the VWAAA from 1975 until 1978.

During the 1970s, Pat, along with an ever-growing group of women officials at Landy Field, was appointed to several Australian Women's Championships at Royal Park in Melbourne and interstate. It was in Hobart in 1973 that Pat took to reading the wind gauge to "try it out".

When the men's and women's State Associations and Geelong Centre's amalgamated in 1982, Pat Agg joined the Victorian Country Committee. A position she would hold until the committee was disbanded in 2009. It was during this time that Pat, along with her dear friend Margaret Saunders and others, would manage the Victorian country team to Canberra for the East Coast Challenge series.

Pat would also continue her input at the local level. She became the Records Officer at Geelong and meticulously maintained the Geelong records, allowing her to become a familiar and friendly official with athletes from all clubs, not just from her Guild. Pat was as proud as punch that the 100-metre record of her daughter Val remained some 57 years after it was established.

At the club level, after amalgamation, Pat continued as Secretary of Guild until 1989. A position she had held for almost a quarter of a century. Another generation of the Agg family became involved in athletics when grandchildren started to compete at Landy Field around this time.

In 1989, Pat became the first female President of the combined Guild club. In fact, it was an all-woman executive with Val Williams as Secretary and Pat's long-time friend Pauline Zuccolin as Treasurer. Pat would remain President until 1995.

On 10 June 1992, Pat was honoured at the State level with an Athletics Victoria Merit Award. Further honours came to Pat when on 10 July 1996, she was elected as a Life Member of Athletics Victoria by her peers.

In 2006 Pat received the Athletics Australia Platinum Service Award for those who have provided service to the sport of athletics for 40 years or more. In 2008, Pat served on the Guild's 100th-anniversary committee.

In 2010, Pat Agg retired from the Board of Geelong Athletics. She had been the Records Officer since 1982 and the Registrar since 1992. Pat had served on the Geelong Centre Board for a staggering 45 years and was presented with a gift and flowers by then President Richard Lawysz.

However, Pat's interest in the sport she loved did not end there. She continued to attend annual meetings and visit Landy Field for championship and special meetings, to present medals and enquire as to the well-being of the many athletes that called her their friend. Her granddaughters would drive Pat to Landy during the week to take a sneak peek.

In December 2012, Pat and fellow Life Members Lauren Johns and Jack Darcy were invited to cut the 50th-anniversary cake of Geelong Athletics.

In January 2018, Pat again returned to Landy Field during the opening ceremony of the Country Championships. This time Pat was to receive the Athletics Victoria 50 years membership award, which had been recognised again by her peers in 2017. AV Life Member Richard Lawysz presented

the award. Australian hurdler Jess Gulli presented flowers, and her daughters Val, Jenny and son Gary were in attendance.

Geelong Athletics' interclub premiership aggregate award for men and women is known as the Pat Agg Trophy. In this award, Pat's legacy and time at Geelong Athletics will be forever remembered. Along with her kindness and caring, not only for her Guild girls but for all athletes (and officials) that crossed her path.

Former Geelong Athletics President Richard Lawysz summed up what most of the Geelong and Victorian athletics family felt, "truly a lovely lady".

Pat was married to Russell Agg for over 65 years, and they had four children, Rob, Val, Jenny and Gary, and many grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

Pat passed away at St John of God Hospital, Geelong, on Tuesday, 9 August 2022.

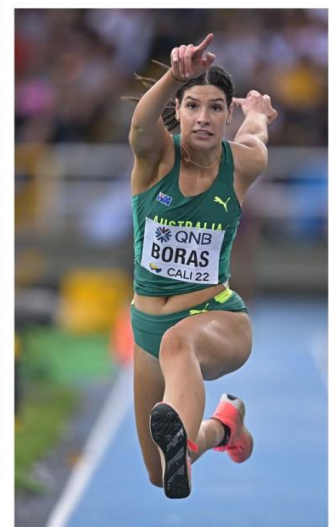

A huge thankyou to the officials and volunteers who assist me each weekend with setting and packing up of the equipment.

The main purchases for the year were a complete set of new blocks which have been well received by both local and visiting athletes. This has resulted in our coaches and school booking getting to use the replaced blocks for coaching and school bookings.

With Geelong hosting countries, new discusses, shot puts, relay battens and a high jump cover were purchased. Other changes that were made this year were to the trolleys where we now have designated trolleys for throws, jumps and high jump. Each trolley is fully equipped which eliminates the need of making several repeated trips to the equipment shed.

We also purchased a new long trolley to use for shelters to assist with taking out and in each weekend.

Thanks also to Nick Foley and Norwood products for the donation of a new timber hurdle for the steeple water jump that badly need replacing after countries.

Because of countries we were able to place markers on our sector markings. This means we have eliminated the need to double check our EDM measurement each week which will result in a time saving during set up.

A big thanks to Raymond Barr who assist me on most weekends. Also, special thanks to the crew from Warrnambool who often take it on themselves to take out the Hurdles for set up. Also thank you to Anna and the board for supporting me and my ideas and allowing me to purchase the items that I need.

My wish list for the next season is new easier wheels for the hurdle trolleys, a designated shot pit trolley, new small circular shade umbrellas for the recording officials and a new "mark 2" (design is in my head) version of a water mister for the hot days.

## SUMMER PORTFOLIO REPORT

After two seasons interrupted by the Covid pandemic we were looking forward to a drama free season – little did we count on the ever-changing climate to impact our season. Floods and post-recovery were the common recurring themes for the season.

The AVSL season 2022-2023 consisted of 10 rounds and 2 virtual play-offs starting early October 2022 through to late March 2023. For the AVSL season – Wyndham was zoned to Geelong once again and actively participated as though they were an affiliated club.

The continuing decline in the number of officials saw the metro zones reduced to only two venues for the season and Geelong was unable to offer any walks events on its program due to a lack of walks judges. Recruiting, training, and retaining officials continues to be an ongoing challenge for the sport.

Following feedback from last season and intra-season we made some modifications to our program this season with:

- Introduction of Control Sheets with minimum height/distances to enter
- Removing of Jump and Go for High Jump
- Alternating the invite throw event between Hammer and Discus
- Restricting of all Field invite events to Geelong “zoned” athletes
- Consolidating horizontal Jump & Go sheets to end of Round
- Additionally, AV removed the ability for club administrators to bulk enter athletes

In addition to the AVSL season, Geelong Athletics also hosted:

- 2023 Steigen Victorian Country Athletics Championships
- High Velocity and AV Throwers Meet
- Mens Discus Throw as part of Maurie Plant World Athletics Meet
- 5km / 10 km Twilight meet
- Steigen Rare Air meet

Our season kicked off well with a pre-season briefing and Round 1 in early October. Round 2 however was when it all went south so to speak. Weather forecasts predicted heavy rain falls and the potential for flooding. We proactively tried to stem the tides with sand bags and frantic calls to Council. Sadly, we watched as the waters flowed into Landy via the storm water drains. The call was made to postpone the day and reschedule.

The next week was frenetic with works to clean up the flooding mess and to have an action plan in place which would mitigate future repeat events. During the clean-up the flood knife gate valves remained closed so when the next rains came the water had nowhere to go. Round 3 saw a wet morning in gum boots trying to get the throws cage ready for action. Luckily, we were able to proceed with all events apart from Hammer and Discus where the circles and landing fields were deemed unsafe for athletes and officials alike. Competition in Bendigo was also affected and their round postponed due to flooding.

Round 4 was relatively uneventful and Round 5 saw the pre-entry of athletes to Hammer and Discus limited to those who missed this event in Round 3. No points were lost as the points for Round 5 were also recorded against Round 3's results.

For the first time, Round 6 saw athletes wear their footy colours to compete as part of our Footy Colours day. With many thanks to Anula Costa, the Geelong AFL Grand Final Cup made its way to Landy Field along with some of the team. Jack Henry, Jed Bews and their families delighted many fans with photos and catchups on their old days with athletics. There was no wiping the smile off our Competition Director, Richard Lawysz, that day!

Christmas came a little early with the gift of new starting blocks (courtesy of one of our successful grant applications) much to the delight of our Round 7 track athletes.

With a five-week hiatus in local competition over the Christmas/New Year period we managed to capitalise on the break and were able to hold the rescheduled Round 2 program as well as new 5k/10k specialty twilight event. Access to enter the rescheduled round was limited to only those originally registered athletes. Unfortunately, due to the timing of this event less than 50% attended.

Following the rescheduled round we held a new event comprising of 3x5k and 2x10k races – thanks to Matthew Gunther who conceived this event. This twilight event proved very popular and was fully subscribed despite no prize money on offer. We saw a mix of recreational/park and track athletes enter – and for some, the formality of this being an AV permit meet was a little challenging. We will be looking to run a very similar format event next summer.

Round 8 was very quickly followed by the 2023 Steigen Victorian Country Athletics Championships. This event was very popular with nearly 900 athletes (60 of which were from interstate) over the three days. The event, as always, was a huge planning and logistical impost and we thank those club helpers who pitched in over and above those duties formally assigned by AV. Special thanks to Freya Poulter, Melissa Pitt and crew for your days spent in the canteen. Big shout out also to the pre-day and post-day set ups which eased the load on our Tech team and ensured we were set up and ready to go every day – thanks to Joe Boras, Peter Lamb, John Sprunt, Aaron Smith and Graeme Watkins who did more than one shift. Congratulations to Christian Paynter (GLG) for taking out the Joyce Lockyer Memorial Award and Brett Coleman (CHI) the Chilwell Athletes Veterans Award.

Slipping in between Rounds 9 and 10, Landy Field hosted the Men's Discus Throw event as part of the inaugural Maurie Plant Meet, a World Athletics Continental Gold Meet. The event saw AUS Olympian Matt Denny and NZL record holder Connor Bell up against local rising star Darcy Giddings and a number of other elite throwers. The New Zealand record was broken by Connor Bell who took out the event and spectators were treated to an impromptu skills clinic run by Matt and Connor. Thank you to them both for their generosity of time and expertise.

Mid-March saw us hosting a High Velocity and AV throwers meet which included the 2022 African Championships Discus Silver medalist, Nora Monie, who not only competed but ran a free post event skills and training talk in the pavilion – our thanks to Nora and her coach.

The Victorian Championships saw many of our athletes excel and the plethora of medallists are listed later in the Annual Report. Following these Champs we moved into our two virtual playoff rounds which were saw athletes competing at their 'home' region/zone instead of at Lakeside with the top and bottom 5 clubs from the AVSL rounds playing off for promotion and/or relegation.

This new format of playoff was challenging in many ways. Starting in the second half of March, after the State Championships, meant we saw less than half of those athletes eligible actual enter. The timing meant that a substantial number of our regular officials were unavailable which put a strain on those who were able to attend - combined with strong winds, 38<sup>o</sup> and a tight timetable made for a

stressful first playoff round. The second playoff, with again reduced numbers, was more relaxed and a terrific day to end the season.

The results saw Wyndham and Chilwell being relegated from the Premier Division and Geelong Guild relegated from Division 2. In a very close battle Athletics South West narrowly missed out on taking the Division 3 shield but did see its promotion to Division 2 for next season – its third divisional promotion in as many seasons – a truly impressive club effort! Corio and Bellarine finished third and fourth in Division 3 with Deakin remaining mid-range of Division 5.

April saw many of our athletes, coaches and officials head north to Brisbane over two separate occasions for the Open/U20 and U13-U18 National Championships with Easter thrown in the middle. We congratulate all those athletes who medalled or got personals bests – no small feat!

The number of athletes entering each round for the season was relatively consistent with last year (c. avg. 221 per round vs 224) with c. 80% being Geelong affiliated club members. Surprisingly though the number of no show (DNS) rates only marginally declined. DNS rates continue to be an issue which sees empty lanes in our pre-seeded races and slots on field sheets that other athletes may have been able to enter.

Geelong Athletics will continue to work with AV and the AVSL Committee to discuss ways to assist with reducing these numbers. Excluding the anomaly Round 2 – DNS rates by clubs were:

Next season we are hoping to extend our seated throw events with the new tie down anchor points having been added to the comp office end discus circle. We were successful in applying for a para-athletics grant (thanks to the hard work put in by Marty Jackson) to fund an adjustable throwing chair for use by any centre athletes for training or competition. This will remove a barrier to entry for many wanting to join athletics as the cost of these chairs and their transport was prohibitive.

Our season was wonderfully captured in images and videos which were graciously shared by Scott Sidley (SS Athletics/GLG), Neal Conder (EHN Sea Photography/GLG), and Marila Kozdra (IND). The reels were particularly popular on our social media accounts and Marila did an amazing job with juggling to capture these between finalising races for photo finish.

AV have advised that there is now a 'grouping' function in the Entry Portal and we will be exploring its use to open a priority entry window for Geelong clubs for next season to secure places on field sheets. Clubs are urged to let us know of any other areas for improvement that can realistically be passed onto the AVSL committee for planning of the next season.

As always, our ability to run a competition relies on the hard work and dedication of our officials and club helpers and we thank them for their contributions – a more detailed acknowledgement can be found in the Officials Report. We continue to urge clubs to actively work on their club cultures to include a focus on growing the number of officials within their membership ranks. Officials are vital to the ongoing viability of our sport and a greater commitment from all is needed.

Finally, we thank and acknowledge all the families, coaches, officials and club administrators who give of their time so generously to provide the athletes the opportunity to participate in their chosen sport and wish everyone all the best for the season to come.

## COACHING PORTFOLIO REPORT

The 2022/23 season was like many others, where we saw an ebb and flow of coaches working in the Geelong region. Of note, the Geelong Athletics community were particularly saddened to lose Nick Hodgson to an overseas relocation and Drew Sayner due to work commitments. This left a massive hole in the speciality horizontal & multi-event coaching areas. Although as many as 25 coaches offer training out of Landy Field, athletes keen to join coaching squads subsequently found many of them full or limited in capacity.

Some training timeslots on the track continue to be more congested than others, mainly during the busy, after-school period of 4-6pm. Coaches do need to be mindful of working around and communicating respectfully with each other to share the track equitably. As an etiquette reminder, coaches should plan to set up at different points of the track, taking up a maximum of 3 lanes.

The Landy Field Coaches' Shed, although at capacity, was generally kept neat this season. This space is shared 50:50 with GLAC and caters for 8 GLAC clubs, 5 GA clubs and a number of independent coaches. It has been an agenda item over the last 3 years to more clearly define and appropriately allocate the shed, however with COVID this hasn't been possible. We look forward to achieving this before the beginning of the 2023-24 season. Last season, it was also identified that there were over 30 coaches who had access to a Coaches' Shed key. With many now lapsed or not actively coaching, there was an effort to recall keys. Unfortunately, this proved to be a difficult task and combined with the key system being deemed difficult to monitor, it was decided to investigate a fob system to permit entry. This new system is currently being costed and it is hoped to be implemented by the start of the 2023 / 24 season.

Whilst Geelong boasts a number of independent coaches and many AV clubs offer club-affiliated coaching, there are still many gaps to be filled, especially with young athletes transitioning from GLAC to GA. Geelong Athletics welcomes organisations such as AV or ATFCA to offer coaching opportunities based at Landy Field as it is often the motivated GLAC parent, with past athletics experience, who may become the coaching professional of the future.

We hope to encourage and support these individuals through their educational journey to become capable and qualified coaches.

It is an age-old problem – how do we attract and retain officials? The reality is that volunteerism in Australia is on the decline. Community life seems to have moved online.

Since Covid, many of our ageing officials have not returned to the track and the sport, as a whole, has struggled to recruit and train volunteers who can regularly commit their time and efforts towards offering a sporting competition for our athletes. This distinct lack of officials to run AVSL has seen the Metro competition offered at only two venues this season as opposed to the four it operated prior to Covid.

Sadly, a lack of walks officials and an inability to attract new candidates to undertake training, meant we were unable to offer any walks as part of this year's programs. Geelong, as a region, is very lucky in the way our club helpers pitch in and enable us to run an extremely popular and efficient program each round. To all of you who stepped up – thank you.

On Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> July 2022, Athletics Victoria hosted the 2021-22 Victorian Officials Function which is an opportunity to celebrate and congratulate the time and effort Officials make in ensuring the success of athletics. We would like to thank and acknowledge our local officials who were recognised at this function:

In July 2022, a review of the Technical Officials Education and Certification System (TOECS) was undertaken to ensure that the development pathway for technical officials (including the education and evaluation process at each certification level) and opportunities to officiate in athletics reflect and are adapted to the ever growing and changing landscape of the sport. We also congratulate Anna Devonish for being nominated by AV for the 2022 Victorian Sports Awards and for being selected as a finalist for the Community Official of the Year Award. At the timing of this report the results have yet to be announced but we wish Anna all the best for this award.

## MARKETING & PUBLICITY PORTFOLIO REPORT

Unfortunately, this Portfolio position continued to remain vacant for yet another year leaving it to other members to maintain some of our social media presences.

Once again, this season had some tremendous support in capturing images and footage from most of our AVSL rounds. We would like to specifically thank Neal Conder (EHN Sea Photography & GLG), Scott Sidley (SS\_Athletics and GLG) and Marila Kozdra (IND) for their contributions. We loved Marila's Instagram reels and stories which she managed to produce and publish in between the pressures of her photo finish duties. Marila did so in response to a strong demand for "live" video footage by our growing Instagram audience. Combined with some funky kits these were exceptionally effective at driving and increasing social media traffic to our sites.

We had ongoing print and digital media support from both the Geelong Advertiser and Geelong Times particularly around our flood instances, the lead up to the Victorian Country Championships (VCAC) and the Maurie Plant meet. The "ones to watch" pieces were particularly interesting to read and we thank each of the clubs for supplying the information necessary to compile these articles.

Our social media presence continued to grow with a Facebook reach of over 87,000 for the year compared to the prior year and Instagram reaching nearly 21,000 compared to nearly 1,000 for the same period. Our tribute to the late Pat Agg had the greatest reach of all posts and was seen by over 7,600 people – reflective of the widespread athletics community respect for a wonderful lady who contributed so much to the sport and the centre.

Our Facebook and Instagram followers both increase from 135 and 224 respectively in the year of this report – the biggest jumps occurring after the VCAC where we made the decision to move to a digital handbook. As well as being more sustainable, the digitisation of the report enabled free access by thousands as compared to less than a couple of hundred through hard copy sales.

Our annual summer awards presentation night was once again in person and livestreamed and we thank Richard Lawysz for his incomparable MC skills and insightful research and Marila for her technical skills at broadcasting this event see a reach of over 450 above those in attendance.

Whilst the media has been very supportive with their articles we have not been as effective we would like to be due this portfolio role being vacant.

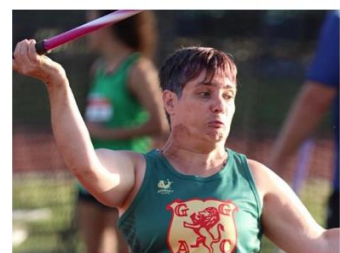
