HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal Athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association with our first State Champions being W.S. Jones (Hammer) and J.D. McRae (Pole Vault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. This year sees the continuation of this with the Athletics Victoria 16km Cross Country Championship being held at Eastern Park.

In December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association was founded with Geelong Women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

In 1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan & John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964 –1966 saw the Geelong Centre assist in the formation of Geelong Little Athletics Centre the number 1 centre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong centre hosted the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the cinder track.

In 1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

In May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International Standard 8 lane track.

1995 Barwon River flooded Landy Field on Melbourne Cup day to such a level there was 6 inches(150mm) water in the WJP Wood pavilion.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Athletics Victoria Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 The first Ron Clarke Classic is held December 17th with World 40+ 1 hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Moneghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter died.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

2008 Geelong hosts the National and Allschools cross country championships at Eastern Park 23-25 August.

2008 The fourth and final(under this name) edition of the Ron Clarke Classic was conducted on 22 Nov 08.

2009 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships(24-26 Jan09) and the Australian Masters Games(21-25 Feb09).

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2008-09

Interclub or Shield as some call it now, at Landy Field is based on being integrated into the AV Shield 3 programme cycle, some say disrupted with the AV Open Score 3 programme cycle mandated such that our centre clubs would be eligible for the Shield Final in mid February, 2009.

The AV Premier League was replaced by a series of specialist meets concentrating on specific events thus giving athletes the exposure to a higher level of competition.

Many athletes achieved success at the Pacific School Games in Nov08 which incorporated the Allschools, as well as Nationals and Olympic Youth Festival level.

However, those athletes who achieved PB's at local level should also be celebrated as that is the fundamental foundation of our sport, achieving your best.

The fourth and final Ron Clarke Classic(at least under this name) was conducted at Landy Field on Saturday(twilight) 22nd November, 2008, again being affected by the inclement weather resulting in the gates being thrown open to the public, small reward for their valued support.

We congratulate and acknowledge the efforts of Lee Troop persevering in promoting this event, however, the harsh economic realities have taken their toll of this meet. Discussions with Athletics Australia would need to be instigated if this meet is to continue in some form.

Less people nominating for board/sub committee positions puts more pressure on those who remain. The number of people running athletics at the grass roots level continue to diminish, so fewer people are required to do so much more. So how can you continue to provide the day to day as well as plan for the medium and long term future?

We did not have a summer portfolio manager this season. Some would not have even noticed the so called seamless transition. Some say who cares, the summer season still happened, but that is unfair on the few who DID make it happen.

Irrespective of the number of participants, we still require so many people to contribute just so that the Centre has a working and viable Board, and make the workload tolerable for all, not to mention interclub competition which requires a minimum number of officials to put on at least the barest of interclub programmes, not to mention community meets which is what we want but we require officials.

The calibre of Geelong officials was highlighted at the Melbourne World Athletics Tour meet where four of the six chief field officials were from Geelong, not to mention borrowing our photo finish equipment.

However, it was pleasing that most board positions were filled this season, which is in contrast to previous years.

Success in the sport attracts/takes away athletes and officials from the local programme to the next level. But this is only a measure of the success they we have achieved.

The number of people willing to give of their time during the season and on Saturday afternoons is diminishing even further, thus putting extra burden on those who are still involved. I repeat again, to use the cliché, "many hands make light work" cannot be overstated.

Perhaps the success, even at short notice due to the extreme heat, of the twilight Geelong championships may need to be strongly considered.

We encourage all to becoming a qualified and registered official gives all of us the opportunity to be involved "in the action" and also assist in improving the presentation of events. Thanks to our Officials portfolio manager Anula Costa for continuing to encourage our officials to undertake other roles and the exams.

Athletics Victoria issued all registered officials with a newly designed uniform (and hat) and 2008 IAAF handbook.

I repeat, we need to deal with the here and now, the normal routine, housekeeping athletic business, but we also need to look 5, 10, 20 years down the athletic track.

Some matters to consider:

Athletics Victoria reviewed the AV score (now Openscore but still requiring improvements) style of summer competition which directly impacted on our local style of competition.

The style of competition, the make up and number of clubs, state and national events, infrastructure (facilities), management procedures and methods and their implementation, support and expansion of coaching programmes and increased participation of officials, marketing and promotion and use of the media.

The Geelong cross country team struggled for numbers this past winter seasons.

Thanks go to the management team of Brett Coleman, Chris Sly and Mary McDonald.

Geelong hosted once again (now becoming a permanent fixture on the AV cross country calendar) the Athletics Victoria 16k cross country on Saturday 12th July, 2008., and furthermore, a real highlight, on Saturday 23rd August, 2008, the Australian cross country championships in conjunction with School Sport Australia.

Both of these events were conducted at Eastern Park, a truly, honest cross country course. Thanks to all who contributed to their success, in particular Geoff McDonald who put in many hours leading up to the events as well as on each of the week ends setting up.

Geelong championships on 31 Jan09 due to the hot weather, were conducted as a twilight meet, and may I say successfully. This may be the way of the future.

Again due to the extreme heat on 7 Feb09, the Cup Competition had to be cancelled to make way for day 2 of the Geelong championships on Sat 7 Mar09.

Geelong Athletics was included in the Barwon Sports Academy programme with seven athletes being accepted into the Academy. Thanks to Anula Costa for pursuing this initiative. Bianca Maurer and Scott Grant taking out the major athletics awards.

We need to cater for the elite as well as the interclub athletes, both of which have vastly different needs to assist their athletic careers, not to mention promotion of the sport itself. How do we keep the elite athletes competing at the local level?

We all need to be realistic about athletics in Geelong. We might have to be radical, but always self critical in looking at ourselves and not promoting self interests personally or club level in order to compete with other community activities.

We need to offer more via the clubs and coaching programmes in order to encourage more Little Athletes to continue in the sport at senior level. We need to continue to bridge that perceived great divide, which is slowly narrowing, between Little Athletics and Seniors by being interactive and cross promotion.

We need to dispel the myth that "senior athletics" is only for the elite. You can do the sport for enjoyment's sake itself. A more equitable balance of numbers would no doubt assist both organisations.

The Geelong Centre continues to be a leader in providing athletic competition for Athletes With a Disability(AWD), being totally integrated within the mainstream athletic programme as well as our Masters athletes.

We have our own photo finish, which provides the opportunity for our computer literate (and not so but willing to learn) to become involved. This facility is virtually expected for every competition to enable athletes to record accurate times and hopefully qualifying times at best. We need more to become involved with/in this valued commodity otherwise why have it? The

self contained photo finish building has greatly enhanced our ability to provide this valued service.

The Geelong Centre total athletic registrations continue to remain about the same, yet the clubs, through their endeavours, attract about 30-60(76 this season) new athletes each season. We need to implement measures to retain and nurture those athletes to remain in the sport.

Geelong hosted the 2009 Victorian Country Championships with Geelong athletes/clubs winning major awards:

Australia Day Awards: Male – Nigel Skurrie – Chilwell
And Chilwell winning the David Kitt Trophy(most points male competition)

Also, the Australian Masters Games were conducted in Geelong from 21 - 25Feb09. Thanks to all officials, in particular, David Barfoot, Anula Costa, Mary and Geoff McDonald, and those volunteers who contributed to its success over 5 days of competition(cross country, road walk and 4 days of track & field).

The high attendance at the annual presentation at the Bush Inn on Friday 27 Mar09 was pleasing. We thank the Bush In for their continued support of Geelong Athletics.

At the AV Officials' and Administrators' luncheon on 26 Apr09, Mary McDonald of Chilwell was named Administrator of the Year. Congratulations to Mary, a worthy recipient and recognition and acknowledgement of her dedicated work in promoting athletics through her club, Chilwell.

The Summer Meeting has been held and set the course for next season. With Athletics Victoria looking to reverting back to a two programme cycle , this will assist with local requirements and preferences.

Financially, the Geelong Centre is continuing to run a steady course.

With capital improvements necessary and continuing equipment renewal and upgrade, our reserves can, if at all, be drawn down only so far before we are not financial.

We thank the efforts of the JLFMC for arranging the photo finish building, and the permanent photo finish camera tower. A great asset to support our ability to conduct athletics.

The Centre was granted government funding to purchase a lap top computer to assist our photo finish judges to be even more efficient.

Our next major financial outlay is the purchase of hurdles, our current hurdles have virtually reached the end of their useful life as well as a second d photo finish lap top computer for which we receive a government grant. We need to focus and make a concerted effort on fund raising and selling and promoting our sport to the market place, for both participants and supporters alike.

The Portfolio Managers have submitted their reports. They offer a review of the season and ways to improve the centre and hopefully encourage your increased input and involvement.

A scan of the finances of the Centre, indicates we are financial, but with our yearly ongoing recurring expenditures, we only have funds for 4-5 years which does not allow for any capital outlays for those "nice to have" items or even upgrades to current standards. This in itself is a challenge to be frugal with our expenditure and more aggressive with our fund raising.

It has been a challenging season, I especially thank David Barfoot, Technical Manager and Anula Costa portfolio manager Officials and further our Portfolio Managers and sub committees for their dedication to the sport and acknowledge and applaud their contributions and their personal support during the season.

Also, Neil Whitmore, who took over the reigns as Treasurer after the untimely accident to Dianne Alsop who has now recovered.

I challenge the clubs and give them the opportunity to fill vacancies on the Board and the sub committees, and to use a cliché, we do not want Geelong Athletics to become stale.

Finally, I thank and acknowledge all the families, officials and club administrators who give of their time so generously to provide the athletes the opportunity to participate in their chosen sport. I trust their appreciation is reciprocated.

TREASURERS REPORT 2008/09

I took over the position of Treasurer in October 2009 due to the unfortunate accident suffered by Dianne Alsop. The accident resulted in a major disruption to Dianne's home and working life. She is making a very good recovery and we wish her all the best. Since assuming the Treasurer's role Dianne has been most helpful to me in settling into the job.

This financial year has been extremely active. In addition to conducting our normal Track and Field and Cross Country seasons, the Centre assisted in the organization and conduct of an Australian Cross Country and Schools Championships at the Eastern Gardens, the Victorian Country Championships and the Australian Masters Games.

The entire Centre's equipment is subject to wear and tear, combined with the harshness of the hard infield surface. As a result, we will be faced with replacement of field game equipment in the near future. Another major item due for immediate replacement is the hurdle equipment. If we are to replace all the hurdles to have sufficient hurdles for all lanes we would be faced with a bill of approximately \$18,000-. This will place a strain on the Centre's finances.

The photo-finish came into full operation last track season and has proven to be most successful with the expertise of Doug Byrt and his helpers. The cost of the equipment has been in excess of budget but the required additional monies were transferred from the Summer Competition funds. The final photo-finish equipment required are 2 laptops to enable results to be recorded at the finish line and transferred to the competition office for recording. We have the funds set aside for the computers as we were fortunate to receive a grant of \$2,000- for this purpose.

Centre Administration \$2,776. (Dr\$1,761.) Profit \$4,538-

The income was down this year as in 2007/08 we received a grant of \$20,000- that was subsequently spent on equipment purchases. The income this year includes a grant of \$2,000- that is being set aside for laptop computer purchases. Equipment hire increased by \$3,864, as more schools used the Centre's equipment for their sports days.

On the expenditure side, \$3,296. was spent on equipment compared to \$30,652. in the previous year. As previously mentioned a vast increase in spending for equipment will be required next year.

Summer Competition. \$1521. (\$13,804-) Deficit \$12,283.

Income for the year was similar to last year. The expenditure increased however due to the closure of the State League and Photo-Finish ledgers totaling \$12,426. The position would therefore be close to break-even without these ledger transfers. The cost to hire Landy Field each Saturday increased by \$1,960- for the 2008/09 track season.

Twilight Trot \$11,825. (\$9,360.) Profit \$2,465-

Geelong Winter Cross Country. \$10,791. (\$9,293.) Profit \$1,497.

The events are well supported with Twilight Trot competition fee income down by \$597- on the previous year, whilst the Winter Cross Country fees were up by \$199-. Both these competitions continue to contribute to the Centre's funds in a healthy way.

Country Championships \$3,933. (\$3,647.) Profit \$286.

The Championships were conducted in Geelong this season; however, on the financial side to date we haven't received any profits. An amount of \$286 was received from a raffle held at the Championships.

We have sought remuneration from AV for our assistance in the organization and conduct of the Championships; to date our request is still under consideration by AV.

Geelong Championships \$1,230-. (Dr\$1,137.) Profit \$2,368.

The ledger increased by \$2,368- for entry fees received for the 2 days of the Championships. The medals awarded were purchased in past years and new medals will require purchase before next years Championships. This may result in a reduced net income from next year's Championships.

Australian Masters Games Dr\$555. Loss \$555.

The Games were held in Geelong over a 5 day period and costs to conduct the games to date have been provided by the Centre. It is expected that AV will reimburse the costs plus some additional remuneration for our time and effort.

Winter State League Cross Country Dr\$148 (\$520) Loss \$669

The loss was largely attributable to the purchase of singlets and screen printing at a cost of \$998. As the singlets are sold, profits will be generated.

There were no debts owing by the Centre as at 31st March 2009.

Overall, the Centre is in a healthy financial position; however, we need to continue to be at the top of our game to be able to provide the facilities and equipment to our Club athletes. This is particularly important with the need to replace all our hurdles and some of the field game equipment for the next track season.

I would like to thank the Board Members, the Geelong Athletic Clubs and particularly Dianne Alsop for their assistance during the Track Season.

This season we managed to get through WITHOUT a Summer Portfolio Manager. Some probably did not know or for that matter not care, because it all happened. As usual, the Centre struggled to attract enough officials to service properly either the track or the field events on offer during competition at Landy Field. Also, the provision of photo finish is an issue when our core operators are unavailable, and we have to revert to hand timing. We need and must increase our pool of photo finish operators to ensure we provide this service every week in Geelong competitions.

Shield Meets

The three programmes series continued this season went reasonably well despite numerous hiccups and imbalance of events between the three programmes conducted. The programmes were forced upon us by Athletics Victoria if our clubs (two out of five) wanted to compete in the Shield Final at the end of the season. As far as I am aware, no Geelong clubs contested the Shield Final on 14 Feb09, which created its own problems with the ever present interpretation of the rules by many and varied personnel from AV. Due to Stage 4 Water Restrictions, steeplechase events were conducted "dry" events, with only one Shield, Country, Masters and Geelong championships, being conducted "wet". The vagaries of our summer weather, shield scheduled for Sat 13 Dec09 cancelled due to wet weather and Geelong championships scheduled for afternoon Sat 31 Jan09 was held as a twilight meet and those scheduled for Sat 7 Feb-09 postponed till 7 Mar09 affected by extreme 40 plus degree heat.

Points Scoring

Thanks to Lyn Taylor and Aleysha Byrt for their efforts in collating the weekly shield points, especially taking into consideration the new AV Openscore point scoring system. We congratulate those clubs who won premierships in their respective age groups. It should be noted that two age groups were not presented as they did not achieve the minimum number of shield points.

Handbook

Many thanks to those who contributed to the publication of the summer handbook, in particular Stuart Robley for collating all the information and following up handbook sponsors.

Ron Clarke Classic

RCC was held on Sat 22 Nov08, the fourth and last of this meet under this name. Lee Troop has withdrawn from the event. The Geelong Multi Event Championships were again held over one day on Sat 20 Dec08 and the numbers were low.

We again offered a reduced entry fee for those athletes not wishing to receive a medal. I believe that it worked well, as a number of athletes chose this cheaper method of entry.

Cup Competition

Due to the postponement of and to make a date available for the Geelong championship, the Cup Competition on Sat 7 Mar09 was unfortunately cancelled this season. This alternate type of competition requires to be supported next season.

Presentation Evening

A great number of people attended the annual presentation of Centre awards, held this year on 27Mar09 at the Bush Inn. With the positive response we will need to consider a larger venue next season.

WINTER PORTFOLIO REPORT 2008

The cross country season was reasonably successful even though our participation numbers did not reach my expectations.

A number of our regular participants did not compete this season because of injury or other activities. It was however pleasing to welcome a number of new participants and particularly the families.

This season we averaged 42 participants per run with a low of 25 and a high of 68.

A nett profit of \$1,499.61 was made for the season, down on last season but still a very pleasing result.

Once again I was able to keep our expenses down by using vouchers from our sponsors for end of season awards.

This season plaques were awarded to 500km and 1000km achievers. Michael Panckridge reached the milestone of 1000km. Rick Hajduk, Cathryn Hoare, Geoff McDonald and Chris Colley achieved 500km.

The Geelong Athletics Cross Country Relay Championships for the Stuart Robley Trophy was held at the Barwon Valley Fun Park on Sunday 20 July 2008. There was a very poor attendance by Clubs with only Athletics Chilwell fielding teams. This was extremely disappointing as this year I deliberately programmed the Championships later in the year in order to allow Clubs to recruit members for relay teams. As a consequence Athletics Chilwell again won the "Stuart Robley Trophy".

The event was reasonably supported and enjoyed by the non registered athletes as a total of 6 composite teams were formed on the day. As a further incentive for people to participate I organised a 1.75km or 3.5km run following the relays. 16 runners participated in the runs.

There was also a low overall attendance by registered club athletes at cross country throughout the season. It is now clear that registered athletes are not interested in cross country and that Geelong Athletics is organising cross country for the health and enjoyment of the ratepayers of Geelong. The interclub points for the Giddings & McKenzie Trophy were – Athletics Chilwell 206, Deakin 61, Geelong Guild 40, Bellarine 30, Corio 0.

The results for each run were published by the Geelong Advertiser usually on a Wednesday following each run. Initially the Advertiser decided it would not publish the write up but only the results yet later on in the season they once again published the full report.

The Geelong News generally published the full report and generally with a "headline". This attracted more publicity for the cross country and the athletes certainly appreciated the exposure, particularly the juniors.

Marker flags were purchased this season to mark out the "true" cross country courses where runs were held on grass. This certainly speeded up course set up as it avoided the carrying around of lots of witches hats.

My sincere appreciation to Greg McDonald of GJ McDonald & Co Real Estate who was once again our naming rights sponsor. Also to Terry and Carol Crawford of Charles Crawford & Sons Funeral Directors who also provided sponsorship money. It is because of the excellent support by these two businesses that I am able to approach our other sponsors and obtain vouchers for our spot prizes.

Pakington Bakery this season donated \$200 in vouchers which was very generous and they indicated that they would be prepared to assist in providing food for functions.

Vouchers were purchased from the following businesses and in return they also donated vouchers – De Grandi Cycle & Sport, Bush Inn Hotel and Bakers Delight Geelong West, Darren McQueen and Pakington Bakery.

The Bush Inn Hotel has recently changed ownership but the new owners honoured the vouchers provided by Tony Kelly and they have also they advised they would be prepared to continue to support Twilight Trot and Cross Country.

Sponsorship vouchers and spot prize items were also received from Barwon Water, COGG Swim Sport & Leisure and Geelong Bowling Lanes.

The support of these sponsors is greatly appreciated and the participants enjoyed receiving spot prizes at the end of each run.

Finally I would like to thank the people who assisted me throughout the season and as a result made my task easier.

Michael Panckridge prepares the Achievement Certificates and also updates the runners statistics following each run.

Richard Lawysz was our timekeeper for the season and Sonia Hamill-Beach helped at the recording of participants at the finish line for most of the season.

I big thank you to Neil Whitmore and John Moore who assisted me with setting up the courses during the season.

Thank you also to Beth Bauer for taking on the administrative role, and to Neil Whitmore and Greg Steenvoorden for course set-up whilst Mary and I were overseas for three of the runs.

Thank you to Bruce Bauer for placing the results on the Geelong Athletics website and for his general up keep of the web site.

To my wife Mary must go my biggest thanks for her great work in obtaining sponsor support, registering participants, the paperwork and in general making sure I carried out all my jobs to ensure the successful running of the event.

Mary and I have decided that 2008 (which I mentioned in my Report last season) is our last season organising the cross country. We have been doing this job for 12 years and would now like to have our Sunday afternoons free of commitments. We have enjoyed our time as organisers and are very proud of the way cross country has increased in popularity over the years and in particular with the popularity of family groups participating. It has also been very pleasing to see participants progress from walking to running and gradually improving their times. We will continue to provide some assistance if required as I will certainly like to continue running.

We are fortunate that Neil Whitmore, Terry Crawford, Karen Wood, Greg Steenvoorden and others have agreed to take over the running of cross country, but we still require someone who is prepared to take registrations and money prior to each run and to oversee the events. This is very pleasing as I believe Geelong Athletics Cross Country has a place for individuals and families to compete on a Sunday afternoon.

16km Athletics Victoria Cross Country Championships

Geelong Athletics was once again host of the 16km Athletics Victoria Cross Country Championships at Eastern Park on Saturday 12 July 2008.

A very good field of approximately 750 athletes participated in the various events from 3km to 16km. The feed back from AV and the participants was excellent and AV has decided that Geelong will be the host of this annual event in the future.

Eastern Park is now the premier cross country venue in the State and Geelong Athletics also has a reputation for being very efficient in organising the event. Although this is very pleasing, the preparation and setting up and dismantling of the course is very time consuming and it is the same people I have to call upon (and I rely upon) to assist me. It is a long day from 7.30am to approximately 6pm and the financial reimbursement from AV of \$300 is very disappointing. In fact in my opinion unless AV is prepared to increase this amount to \$500 we should seriously consider not accepting to host the event in the future.

I would like to express my appreciation to Richard Lawysz, Neil MacDonald, Graeme Watkins, John Moore, and Chris Sly for assisting me with the set up and pack up. Thank you to Elizabeth Bauer for making up the lunches for the officials. Anula Costa was also of great help in organising the Geelong officials for the event. Without the great support of all the people who helped we would not have the great reputation we have with AV and the participants for putting on a top class event.

Australian Cross Country Championships and Schools Sport Australian Cross Country Championships

Because of our reputation as being a very efficient organisation to organise cross country and the reputation of Eastern Park as the premier cross country venue in the State Geelong Athletics was appointed to organise the Championships at Eastern Park on Saturday 23 August, followed by on Monday 25 August the Schools Sport Australian Cross Country Relay Championships.

A working party comprising of Athletics Victoria, Schools Sport Victoria, Athletics Australia and Geelong Athletics was appointed to organise the events. Richard Lawysz and I represented Geelong Athletics.

The City of Greater Geelong, following an approach by Tim Crosbie of Athletics Victoria held the events to be a "major event" and contributed \$10,000 to Athletics Victoria for the organisation.

From this grant Athletics Victoria purchased 8 large tents (for the use of the school children from the States and Territories and New Zealand) and they propose to donate a tent to each of the regions.

The Australian Championships attracted approximately 90 runners in the men's Open event whilst the female Open event attracted approximately 70 runners from all around Australia.

The Schools Sport Australian Championships attracted over 560 elite runners from all States and Territories of Australia and from New Zealand. The ages ranged from 10 years of age to under 20. The athletes competed over distances of 2000 to 8000m.

The States and Territories also attracted AWD entries.

On Monday 25 August the schools athletes competed in relays and time trials over distances of 1000 to 3000m.

Without question this was the largest athletic event and the highest quality of athletes which Geelong has hosted. Together with the large number of support staff and parents and friends in attendance at the events numbers were approximately 1400 people on the Saturday and a lesser number on the Monday.

Given the importance of the event it was a very busy and time consuming task. Geelong Athletics was the appointed Local Organising Body responsible for the course design and setup. Because of the commencement of the first event on the Saturday at

9am and the Monday at 8.30am it was necessary to carry out preparatory work on the Friday and on the Sunday and to commence work on the Saturday and Monday at 6.15am.

It was an extremely tiring time for all involved.

Except for problems with catering (which was not a Geelong Athletics responsibility) the event was an outstanding success and Geelong's reputation has been enhanced and as a result we are likely to attract other cross country events in the future. But once again I raise the issue of financial reimbursement for the effort involved.

In order to reduce the time in measuring the course following set up on the day of competition the course(s) were marked out with white marker paint and measured on the Friday so that on the competition day it was only necessary to walk the course and mark it with flags. This was a great time saver on the competition days.

I must make special mention of the people who gave their assistance in setting up the courses for the Saturday and Monday events and in a number of cases these people also stayed on and officiated and then helped to dismantle the courses on the Saturday and Monday.

Without their assistance this major event could not have been held in Geelong.

Neil Whitmore assisted me on the Friday, Saturday, Sunday (morning) and Monday.

John Moore on Friday, Saturday and Monday.

Richard Lawysz and Greg Steenvoorden on the Saturday and Monday.

Ray Hobbs on the Saturday, Sunday (afternoon) and Monday.

Neil, Richard, Ray and Greg took time off from work to assist.

Thank you also to Neil Macdonald, Jack Verstraten, Graeme Watkins for their assistance on Saturday.

Thank you also to Mary McDonald and the other people who stayed back on the Saturday and Monday to clean up the rubbish which was left behind.

Finally I must also highlight the hard work and assistance provided by Tim Crosbie of Athletics Victoria.

Richard was also a member of the Organising Committee and was required to attend Athletics Victoria for planning meetings.

On behalf of Geelong Athletics I have billed Athletics Victoria \$1000 for the events in which I personally put in approx. 50hrs. and overall approx. 126hrs was put in by the above in just setting up and dismantling the courses. On top of this is the time taken to officiate on the Saturday and Monday by some of the above and the officials organised by Anula Costa.

TWILIGHT TROT REPORT 2008/2009

The season commenced on Monday 27th October 2008 and concluded on 9 March 2009, a total of 18 runs.

The Trot was very successful both in relation to participating numbers and in the profit made for the Geelong Centre.

This season we had an average of 60 participants with a high of 72 and a low of 36. Once again we seemed to attract new participants each week but they then tend to run only occasionally during the season. There is a hard core of approximately 40 participants who participate each week and 20 – 25 who are either new runners or people who turn up for the occasional run. As usual numbers declined slightly following the Xmas break.

Our U13 participation was reasonable and numbers tended to fluctuate.

This season we made a profit of \$1730.00 approx. This is down on last year because we donated the proceeds of one of our runs to the Fire Appeal together with further donations from runners. In total \$226.70 was raised as a result of this run.

GJ McDonald & Co. Real Estate was again the naming rights sponsor for the "Trot" as a result of their donation of \$300.

Charles Crawford & Sons Funeral Directors was a major sponsor donating \$180. Their continuing sponsorship of the Twilight Trot is gratefully appreciated as it means we are able to approach other sponsors and purchase vouchers and receive sponsorship vouchers in return. Vouchers were purchased from Bakers Delight, De Grandi Cycle & Sport and the Bush Inn Hotel and in return they donated vouchers.

We are also able to reduce our expenditure for the season by using sponsors vouchers for the "End of Season" Awards.

The results of each run were published in the Geelong Advertiser and mid way through the season in the Geelong News. The Geelong News (when space was available) generally published the write up (with a bold headline) but rarely the results. Overall, the publishing of the results was good publicity for the Trot and helps to attract people.

Participants appreciated the spot prizes which were handed out after each run and most people tend to stay until after the run to here the announcement of results and the awarding of the spot prizes.

Once again Mary ran "Introduce a Friend" whereby each person who introduced a new participant to the "Trot" went into a draw for an end of season prize of a \$10 DeGrandi voucher.

Course records were also kept for both the short and long courses for the various age groups. This also created an interest particularly with the juniors when they established new records. Personal best times were also reported in the write-up for the newspapers.

The final run for the season was the "Joyce Lockyer Memorial Trophy", handicap race for the senior runners over two laps of the long course. Mark Austin was the winner of this Trophy.

The juniors were also handicapped for one lap of the long course. The winner of the race was Harry Hockley-Samon. The winner and place getters each received medals.

Following the run there was a BBQ and presentation of awards.
