HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association (VAAA) with our first State champions being W.S. Jones (hammer) and J.D. McRae (pole vault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the VAAA 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. In 2012, the Athletics Victoria Road Relay Championships being held at the Belmont Criterium on 11 August 12.

December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) was founded with Geelong women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan and John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964–1966 saw the Geelong Centre assist in the formation of the Geelong Little Athletics Centre, the number 1 centre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong Centre hosted the VAAA Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the original cinder track.

1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships, which for the first time attracted a major sponsorship from The Weekly Times.

May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated in law as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International standard 8 lane track.

1995 Barwon River flooded Landy Field on Melbourne Cup day to such a level there was 6 inches (150mm) of water in the WJP Wood Pavillon.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League (A Grade) to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships under a different AV management structure, where AV received and processed all entries, the Centre providing the venue and the finances being distributed differently.

The first Ron Clarke Classic is held on 17 December with World 40+ 1 hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Moneghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter passes away.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

2008 Geelong hosts the National and All schools cross country championships at Eastern Park 23-25 August.

The fourth and final (under this name) edition of the Ron Clarke Classic was conducted on 22 November.

2009 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (24-26 January) and the Australian Masters Games (21-25 February).

2010 Lighting installed at Landy Field in March

2012 The Victorian Road Relay Championships held at Geelong in August. The first time this event has been held outside of Melbourne.

A 50th anniversary dinner held at Dromoland House on 7 December attended by 140 people including AV President, Ian Jones. Richard Lawysz, Gabrielle Blythe and Richard Colman all spoke of their time at Geelong and in athletics.

2013 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (26-28 January)

Geelong hosts the Australian Masters Games in October.

Life Member and former Geelong Officials Club President, Wes Marshman passes away.

2014, Life Member Jack Darcy passes away.

2015, New hammer cage installed and new equipment shed erected at Landy Field.

2016, Geelong Athletics hosts the 2016 Victorian Country championships(22-24January).

2017, Life Member Ron Palmer passes away.

Chilwell celebrates its 50th Anniversary.

2017 John Landy Field Management Committee disbanded, management of Landy Field directly by City of Greater Geelong, John Landy Field Advisory Committee established.

2018 Life Member Bob Fossey passes away.

2019 Life Member Stuart Robley passes away.

2020 Geelong hosts the 2020 Victorian Country championships(25-27January).

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2019-20

Like a broken record, the same themes and issues still exist:

- (i) board vacancies.
- (ii) shield competition.
- (iii) update equipment and venue.

A reformatted Shield competition, now called AVSL with the five Geelong clubs in differing divisions competing on a club basis at Landy Field. Wyndham Athletic Club was attached to the Geelong Region for AVSL competition only. The summer season commenced on Sat 5 Oct19 and was based on the AV Shield 2 programme cycle, culminating in the Shield Final at Albert Park on Saturday 22Feb20. Shield was again conducted as twilight meets on Saturday evenings in Jan20.

AV have introduced the on line entry system for shield competition, with most athletes having done so, however, some still persist in not doing so and enter on the day.

Many athletes achieved success at the Allschools in Perth as well as the Victorian Championships. Unfortunately, the Nationals scheduled for Sydney were eventually cancelled due to the COVID 19 virus.

I thank sincerely those who volunteered to "make it happen" and their input to improving athletics in Geelong. There are those "behind the scenes" in an unofficial capacity who undertake various tasks to assist the board in providing competition for our athletes. And the number of such volunteers is diminishing putting undue and unwarranted pressure on them to provide what the athletes want.

There will be vacancies on the Board at the end of this 2019-20 season. There seems to be a reticence to be involved and leave to others "to make it happen", leaving it to the "same old, same old" who need to take on multiple roles to ensure Geelong Athletics functions and provides competition for our athletes.

I've said this previously, well it's time for a generational change and maybe a realisation of and appreciation of what is actually required to "make it happen".

We still require more qualified and registered officials weekly to manage the conduct of the sport. We have had instances of athletes missing out on qualifiers or records. We are reliant on club helpers to put on events, yet athletes just want more.

The number of people willing to give of their time during the season and on Saturday afternoons is diminishing even further, thus putting extra burden on those who are left and still involved. I repeat *again*, to use the cliché, "many hands make light work" cannot be overstated.

We encourage all to becoming a qualified and registered official gives all of us the opportunity to be involved "in the action" and also assist in improving the presentation of events.

We congratulate our International representatives, Jacob Sesar(triple gold medallist), Kirstie Newcombe, Eliesha Byrt(silver medallist) and Drew Semmens(bronze medallist) at the INAS Games in Brisbane and Marty Jackson(bronze medallist) at the World Para Athletics Championships in Dubai.

We also congratulate Alison Reed on her AV Region Official of the Year.

We encourage all club helpers to increase their knowledge through the Athletics Australia web site on line learning and then put it into practice at shield competition.

We need to consider the style of competition, support and expansion of coaching programmes and training and increased participation of officials, marketing and promotion and use of the media.

The management of the Twilight Trot series in summer has been taken over by The Running Company, a most rewarding event for all concerned, health and social benefits for participants and financially for Geelong Athletics.

We need to cater for all our athletes, the vast range of talent requiring a vast range of needs to support their respective athletic careers, not to mention promotion of the sport itself. How do we keep the elite athletes competing at the local level?

We need to offer more via the clubs and coaching programmes in order to encourage more Little Athletes to continue in the sport at senior level. We need to continue to bridge that perceived great divide, which is slowly narrowing between Little Athletics and Seniors by being interactive and cross promotion.

With the reconstruction of the shield competition, Geelong Athletics basically extends a free invitation for Little Athletes to come any week.

We need to dispel the myth that "senior athletics" is only for the elite. You can do the sport for enjoyment's sake itself. A more equitable balance of numbers would no doubt assist both organisations.

The Geelong Centre total athletic registrations continue to remain about the same, yet the clubs, through their endeavours, attracted 48 new athletes this season. We need to implement measures to retain and nurture those athletes to remain in the sport.

At the 2020 Victorian Country Championships conducted in Geelong, Mackenzie Mielczarek(Corio) and Christian Davis(Chilwell) were awarded the Australia Day medal for their outstanding performances and Tiana Boras(Chilwell) the Stuart Hunter memorial shield. TREASURER'S REPORT 2019-20

The financial standing of Geelong Athletics (GA) is sound.

Our major sources of income are Twilight Trot and schools equipment hire as well as grants monies, which is dependent on applications being successful.

Twilight Trot income for 2019-20 was \$1,674.40, a cumulative surplus of \$36,504.58.

Athletics Victoria has reimbursed Geelong Athletics(GA) for venue hire, equipment, officials and trophies for \$9,500 in 2017-18, \$10,000 for 2018-19 and \$11,000 for 2019-20.

Geelong Athletics was successful in receiving two grants from City of Greater Geelong, Healthy and Connected Communities Programme \$2,000 for equipment and Community Events Programme, \$5,000 for the Country Championships.

Furthermore, Steigen became the naming rights sponsor for the Country Championships for \$3,000.

Athletics Victoria also contributed to the Country Championships with \$5,000 plus reimbursement of meals for officials, \$2,655.

Schools equipment hire procedure has been refined in conjunction with Council so that we are now receiving payments in a reasonably timely manner direct form the schools.

So far this calendar year to 31Mar20, we have had 20 schools bookings, with only 1 school still to pay, having received \$8,120. Note, we have already received bookings up to Sep20.

However with the Government restrictions imposed on gatherings due to the Covid 19 virus, ten(10) schools have either cancelled outright or postponed their athletics days at Landy Field for March and April 2020.

In April19, GA received a grant from Grill'd of \$100.

For summer shield competition 2019-20, GA received monies from trialling athletes, \$575.

Substantial savings of approx. \$4,000 were gained by insuring through AV.

Transferred petty cash(\$130) to Centre Admin.

A major future cost will be the purchase and repair to the pole vault mat cover, approx. \$17,000.

SUMMER PORTFOLIO MANAGER'S REPORT – Season 2019/20

The new AVSL season started on 5Oct19 and proceeded over 12 rounds of shield concluding on 8Feb20.

AVSL is broadly club based with premiership as well as promotion/relegation between divisions being determined by athletes in all age groups contributing to club points.

Local Geelong clubs were allocated by AV into appropriate divisions:

Bellarine – Division 3, Corio – Division 3, Chilwell - Premier, Deakin – Division 5, Geelong Guild – Premier

Wyndham was allocated to Geelong for the summer AVSL season.

The majority of athletes still enter online, however some still do enter on the day. Athletes need to be cognisant there are limits on number of athletes for field events, namely max. 15 per sheet. Also, athletes need to get themselves organised and to be aware of and comply with the requirement to close entries 30 minutes prior to the event start time.

Athletes need to remember to bring and wear their registration bib numbers.

There were a number of trialling athletes which contributed to the GA finances, \$575.

Two different rounds were conducted.

Nitro round with non standard track events.

Relay round, with only relay track events. Clubs need to be more efficient with nominating clearly relay entries and also ensuring their club members know (a) which relay they are running in and (b) which leg of that relay they are running. I believe there is merit that clubs enter relays online with only minor changes on the day.

Thanks to all the officials and club helpers as the programme is so dependent on their valued contribution.

I thank especially Marila Kozdra, Geoff Marshman, Joanne Lambert and Josephine Mirarchi for their specific contributions before, during and after each shield round which many take for granted when they come to compete.

Initial issues with the time clock and automatic wind gauge were resolved.

No doubt the highlight of the season were the successful Steigen Country Championships, thanks to all who contributed to that success.
