HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal Athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association with our first State Champions being W.S. Jones (Hammer) and J.D. McRae (Polevault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. This year sees the continuation of this with the Athletics Victoria 8km Cross Country Championship being held at Eastern Park.

In December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association was founded with Geelong Women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

In 1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan & John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964 –1966 saw the Geelong Centre assist in the formation of Geelong Little Athletics Centre the number 1 centre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong centre hosted the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the cinder track.

In 1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

In May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International Standard 8 lane track.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Athletics Victoria Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 The first Ron Clarke Classic is held December 17th with World 40+ 1 hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Monaghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter died.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2007-08

Athletics returned to its "traditional" Geelong home at Landy Field after its extensive refurbishment and we acknowledge the Corio venue for hosting us last season so we could provide athletic competition for our athletes.

W acknowledge the work and negotiations the John Landy Field Management Committee has contributed to the upgrade of Landy Field of which we all benefit as well as the general Geelong community and schools.

Clubs have recruited well, however, the ongoing concerns with retention of numbers of athletes continues. Just review our registration figures the last few years.

Interclub at Landy Field was based on being integrated into the AV Shield 3 programme cycle, some say disrupted with the AV Score 3 programme cycle mandated such that our centre clubs would be eligible for the Shield Final in mid February, 2008.

The AV Premier League(based on rankings achieved at interclub), replacement for State League, gave many younger athletes the exposure to a higher level of competition, mainly due to the higher profile athletes not competing, thus putting Premier League in jeopardy next season.

Many athletes achieved success at National Allschools, Nationals and Olympic Youth Festival level.

However, those athletes who achieved PB's at local level should also be celebrated as that is the fundamental foundation of our sport, achieving your best.

The Ron Clarke Classic returned to Landy Field on Sunday 2nd December, 2007 for the third occasion with a mixed response from the public and athletes alike, the unkind weather maybe partly to blame. The event will continue next season but with a modified/revised programme/format on a Saturday evening.

We congratulate and acknowledge the efforts of Lee Troop to persevere in promoting this event, which gives athletes the opportunity to perform and the Geelong public to witness their performances.

In 2007, we were honoured that our athletes were selected for the World Championships in Osaka, and World Youth(u/18) Championships in Ostrava.

Several officials have stepped back from their commitment after the Commonwealth Games, so that puts more pressure on those who remain and perhaps we can persuade them to nurture the next generation. The number of people running athletics at the grass roots level continues to diminish, so fewer people are required to do so much more. So how can you continue to provide the day to day as well as plan for the medium and long term future?

We need to continue our critical appraisal of where we are, where we are heading, where do we want to be and how to get there.

Irrespective of the number of participants, we still require so many people to contribute just so that the Centre has a working and viable Board, and make the workload tolerable for all, not to mention interclub competition which requires a minimum number of officials to put on at least the barest of interclub programmes, not to mention community meets which is what we want but we require officials.

However, it was pleasing that most board positions were filled this season, which is in contrast to previous years.

Success in the sport attracts/takes away athletes and officials from the local programme to the next level. But this is only a measure of the success they we have achieved.

The number of people willing to give of their time during the season and on Saturday afternoons is diminishing, thus putting extra burden on those who are still involved. To use the cliche, "many hands make light work" cannot be overstated.

Becoming a qualified and registered official gives all of us the opportunity to be involved "in the action" and also assist in improving the presentation of events. Thanks to our Officials portfolio manager Anula Costa for encouraging our officials to undertake the exams, whose results were outstanding. Now the challenge is to put this "theory" into ongoing practice.

Athletics Victoria has issued all registered officials with a newly designed uniform(and hat) and 2008 IAAF handbook.

We need to deal with the here and now, the normal routine, housekeeping athletic business, but we also need to look 5, 10, 20 years down the athletic track.

Some matters to consider:

Athletics Victoria will no doubt review the AV score style of summer competition which will directly impact on our local competition and traditional Saturday afternoons. The style of competition, the make up and number of clubs, state and national events, infrastructure(facilities), management procedures and methods implementation, support and expansion of coaching programmes and increased participation of officials, marketing and promotion and use of the media.

The Geelong cross country team won the prestigious mens A grade teams event,

braking the stranglehold of Glenhuntly.

The Geelong cross country team continues to prosper and succeed under the patronage of Lee Troop and management of Neil McDonald, however, Neil will be stepping down from his role in 2008 and a new management structure under Mary McDonald, Chris Sly and Brett Coleman.

Geelong will be hosting once again the Athletics Victoria 16k cross country on Saturday 12th July, 2008., and furthermore, a real highlight, on Saturday 23rd August, 2008, the Australian cross country championships in conjunction with School Sport Australia.

Both of these events will be conducted at Eastern Park, a truly, honest cross country course. We will be looking to your support of these prestigious events to make them an enjoyable experience and successful event.

The Cup Competition, even though only a single day competition this season, provided a different camaraderie and competition amongst the athletes and this response encourages continuity of the concept.

Geelong Athletics has been included in the Barwon Sports Academy programme with seven athletes being accepted into the Academy. This will give added assistance to our younger elite and developing athletes. Thanks to Anula Costa for pursuing this initiative.

We need to cater for the elite as well as the interclub athletes, both of which have vastly different needs to assist their athletic careers, not to mention promotion of the sport itself. How do we keep the elite athletes competing at the local level?

We all need to be realistic about athletics in Geelong. We might have to be radical, but always self critical in looking at ourselves and not promoting self interests personally or club level in order to compete with other community activities.

The coaching programmes for both coaches and athletes alike need to get more exposure and continue within the club structures and success does come as evidenced above.

We need to offer more via the clubs and coaching programmes in order to encourage more Little Athletes to continue in the sport at senior level. We need to bridge that perceived great divide, which is slowly narrowing, between Little Athletics and Seniors by being interactive and cross promotion.

We need to dispel the myth that "senior athletics" is only for the elite. You can do the sport for enjoyment's sake itself. A more equitable balance of numbers would no doubt assist both organisations.

The Geelong Centre continues to be a leader in providing athletic competition for Athletes With a Disability(AWD), being totally integrated within the mainstream athletic programme as well as our Masters athletes.

We have our own photo finish, which provides the opportunity for our computer literate(and not so but willing to learn) to become involved. This facility is virtually expected for every competition to enable athletes to record accurate times and hopefully qualifying times at best. We need more to become involved with/in this valued commodity otherwise why have it?

I continue to encourage all to be involved in any small way to contribute to improve our sport.

The Geelong Centre total athletic registrations continue to remain about the same, yet the clubs, through their endeavours, attract about 30-60 new athletes each season. We need to implement measures to retain and nurture those athletes to remain in the sport.

The 2009 Victorian Country Championships are scheduled to be conducted in Geelong in January, 2009, for which Geelong will be submitting a formal tender as required by AV.

Furthermore, the Australian Masters Games will be conducted in Geelong from 20 Feb to 1 Mar 09. A busy time for Geelong Athletics.

The high attendance at the annual presentation at the Bush Inn on Friday 28th March, 2008 was pleasing and surprising, if only they told us that they were all coming. We thank the Bush In for their continued support of Geelong Athletics.

The Summer Meeting has been held and set the course for next season. The Summer Meeting gives you all the opportunity to improve our sport, BUT not all take advantage of this.

There is no point criticising decisions made during the season, you have your opportunity, not to mention vacancies on the Board and through the various subcommittees.

Financially, the Geelong Centre is continuing to run a steady course.

With capital improvements necessary and continuing equipment renewal and upgrade, our reserves can, if at all, be drawn down only so far before we are not financial.

We have purchased a new pole vault landing area with financial assistance for the City of Greater Geelong, for which we are grateful, as well as a new weather proof cover. Of our own equipment, we require new hurdles and a second computer to compliment the photo finish system.

Self contained, permanent photo finish office, lights and a medal presentation area outside the track. These infrastructure works will need to be advanced through cooperation and discussion with the John Landy Field Management Committee.

JLFMC has submitted drawings for the photo finish building, and a permanent photo finish camera tower has been erected in February, 2008.

The Centre was granted government funding to purchase some new hurdles, as well as obtaining a Telstra grant for throws equipment and training hurdles.

We need to focus and make a concerted effort on fund raising and selling and promoting our sport to the market place, such as the planned Community Athletics programme, for both participants and supporters alike.

We also take the opportunity to congratulate Geelong Guild who will achieve their centenary on 12th July, 2008, an outstanding achievement providing the Geelong community access to the sport of athletics.

GEELONG ATHLETICS – SUMMER REPORT 2007/2008

This season has gone too quickly and has been difficult in some ways. However, the Geelong Centre attempted to provide appropriate competitions throughout the summer season to adequately provide for all members. The season started off at normal season date with the newly reconstructed arena. There were many fast times on the track which was fantastic for all the athletes.

As usual, the Centre struggled to attract enough officials to service properly either the track or the field events on offer during competition at Landy Field.

Shield Meets

The three series programs for this season went well despite numerous hiccups. The programs were forced upon us by Athletics Victoria if our clubs (two out of five) wanted to compete in the Shield Final at the end of the season. As far as I know, only 2 age groups out of the possible 12 from Geelong clubs competed in the Shield Final.

The Shield Final at Doncaster in February created its own problems with the ever present interpretation of the rules by many and varied personnel from AV.

Due to Stage 4 Water Restrictions, steeplechase event was held a couple of times without the water jump and records could not be ratified. I have noticed that Geelong based athletes competed this event in Ballarat or Melbourne instead where water jumps were available. Maybe the Centre needs to look at a water tank for this purpose.

Due to hot conditions in the New Year, the shield meet was cancelled which was disappointing as we had athletes from Interstate and Melbourne keen to compete.

Points Scoring

Lyn had her spreadsheet set up using the Geelong Athletics formula and I find it much easier than manually calculated using the old fashion calculator. Lyn and I gathered one night during the week to review the results, ensuring results were correct and then undertaking the lengthy task of calculating the interclub points. Congratulations to the clubs who won premierships in their respective age groups.

AV Score, the Athletics Victoria interclub computer program, assisted us with the correct placings of athletes and a permanent record of their achievements. It was able to rank the athletes for graded track competition and also provide field rankings as well. These were used for Premier League, State and National rankings.

Handbook

The summer committee spent countless hours preparing the details and presentation for the season's summer handbook, which included reviewing past handbooks, rule changes and designs to follow the AV handbook. All work was completed on time and it was printed by Gordon TAFE Printing Department. I was very pleased with the layout, format and style of the handbook however the selling of the handbook is disappointing. The clubs need to encourage athletes to purchase the handbook so they will be provided with information for the whole Summer competition.

Geelong Championships

The Geelong Championships Day 1 being held on the 12th of January 2008 clashed with the AV Under 23 State Championships. The day went well, however the number of athletes was

disappointing possibility due to Under 23 State Championships and school holidays. Day 2 being held almost 1 month later took away the championship feel. Maybe the Championships being held over one weekend needs to be reconsidered to regenerate the interest.

The Geelong Multi Event Championships were again held over one day and the numbers were very poor. This may possibly have been due to clashes with U20 & U23 National, Vic Masters and Little Athletics Championships. We may need to publicise this more during the season to encourage entries.

We again offered a reduced entry fee for those athletes not wishing to receive a medal. I believe that it worked well, as a large number of athletes chose this cheaper method of entry.

The Relay Championships were held on Day 1 and 2 however the number of entries were below standard. Re-introduction into interclub competition may provide more opportunity for athletes to compete.

Cup Competition

Due to the tight program alignment with AV only one day of Cup Competition was possible. It was held over the long weekend in March and appeared to be successful. The number of athletes was just average however those people who competed found the experience enjoyable.

Presentation Day

A great number of people attended the annual presentation of Centre awards, held this year on 28 March at the Bush Inn. This is fantastic and hopefully will do the same next season.

Next Season

The Geelong calendar for 2008/09 will be prepared after the completion of the AV, AA, VLAA & GLAC calendars have been advised.

Conclusion

I wish to thank to Lyn Taylor, who has helped me in setting up the calendar for this season, preparing points, preparing and reviewing timetables for Cup Competition and preparing Meet Manager for Geelong Championships, which has greatly assisted me to perform my duties as Summer Portfolio Manager. I wish to also thank Chris Sly, who has helped me in counting the monies for the Geelong Championships, preparing and reviewing timetables for the Championships.

Due to time constraints with my training for triathlons and other commitments, I will not be continuing as the Summer Portfolio Manager. I wish the new Summer Portfolio Manager all the best for coming year.

As Summer Portfolio Manager for three seasons I have enjoyed my own time doing this job. The overall experience of seeing the young athletes develop, improve their skills and achieve their goal, and seeing an increase in numbers of veteran athletes competing for their enjoyment has also been rewarding.

Finally I would like to thank to all athletes, officials, parents and friends for their support this season. Thank you also to my fellow Board Members for their encouragement.

Cross Country Report 2007

The cross country season was reasonably successful even though our participation numbers did not reach my expectations.

A number of our regular participants did not compete this season because of injury or other activities. It was however pleasing to welcome a number of new participants and particularly the families.

This season we averaged 39 participants per run with a low of 25 and a high of 49.

A nett profit of \$1,908.96 was made for the season, slightly down on last season but still a pleasing result.

Once again I was able to keep our expenses down by using vouchers from our sponsors for end of season awards.

Next season I do not intend to continue with the awarding of a sash for participants achieving 500km given the cost of the sash. A cheaper acknowledgement of the achievement will be determined.

The sum of \$110 was raised through the auctioning of a three month membership of COGG Swim Sport and Leisure.

A further sum of \$150.50 was raised by selling flower bulbs.

The Geelong Athletics Cross Country Relay Championships for the Stuart Robley Trophy was held on our second run of the season at the Barwon Valley Fun Park. Once again there was a very poor attendance by Clubs. Athletics Chilwell fielded two teams and Corio one team. Deakin and Geelong Guild which are large clubs could not field one team. Clubs and athletes must show more support for our Championship events even though a number of athletes do compete for the Regional Cross Country Team.

As a consequence Athletics Chilwell again won the Stuart Robley Trophy.

Despite the poor attendance by club athletes the event was well supported and enjoyed by the non registered athletes as a total of 8 composite teams were formed on the day. As a further incentive for people to participate I organised a 1.75km or 3.5km run following the relays. 18 runners participated in the runs.

Next season I propose to hold this event later in the year in the hope that more registered athletes can attend and also not to disrupt the start of the season for the non registered participants in cross country.

There was in general a poor overall attendance by registered club athletes. The interclub points for the Giddings & McKenzie Trophy were – Athletics Chilwell 79, Bellarine 66, Geelong Guild 3, Deakin 3, Corio 2.

The results for each run were generally published by the Geelong Advertiser on the following Wednesday. Unfortunately the Advertiser didn't publish the end of season photo of the major award winners with our sponsor Greg McDonald.

My sincere appreciation to Greg McDonald of GJ McDonald & Co Real Estate who was once again our naming rights sponsor. Also to Terry and Carol Crawford of Charles Crawford & Sons Funeral Directors who also provided sponsorship money. It is because of the excellent support by these two businesses that I am able to approach our other sponsors and obtain vouchers for our spot prizes. Both these businesses also provide sponsorship for the Twilight Trot.

Vouchers were purchased from the following businesses and in return they also donated vouchers – De Grandi Cycle & Sport, Pakington Bakery, Bush Inn Hotel and Bakers Delight Geelong West. Sponsorship vouchers and spot prize items were also received from Barwon Water, Bunnings Waurn Ponds and Geelong Bowling Lanes.

The support of these sponsors is greatly appreciated and the participants in particular the junior runners liked receiving spot prizes at the end of each run.

Finally I would like to thank the people who assisted me throughout the season and as a result made my task easier.

Michael Panckridge prepares the Achievement Certificates and also keeps the statistics for every participant who runs.

Richard Lawysz was our timekeeper for the season and Leisa Shields helped at the recording of participants at the finish line for a number of the runs.

I would also like to thank Bruce Bauer for placing the results on the Geelong Athletics website and for his general up keep of the web site.

To my wife Mary must go my biggest thanks for her great work in obtaining sponsor support, registering participants, the paperwork and in general making sure I carried out all my jobs to ensure the successful running of the event.

Mary and I have decided that 2008 will be our last season organising the cross country. We have been doing this job for 11 years and would now like to have our Sunday afternoons free. If there is anyone who would like to take over the position and learn where to mark the courses etc. please contact me.

16km Athletics Victoria Cross Country Championships

Geelong Athletics was honoured to host the 16km AV Cross Country Championships at Eastern Park on Saturday 23 June 2007.

More than 700 athletes participated in the various events from 3km to 16km. The feed back from AV and the participants was excellent and it is highly likely that Geelong will be hosting this event on a yearly basis.

Although Geelong Athletics raised more than \$700 from the event the prior preparation and setting up and dismantling of the course is very time consuming.

A number of us commenced setting up at 7.30am and along with officiating did not finish dismantling the course until 6.15pm. A long exhausting day!

TWILIGHT TROT REPORT 2007/2008

The season commenced on Monday 29th October 2007 and concluded on 10 March 2008, a total of 18 runs.

Once again we had a very successful season with a record high of 87 participants (and a low of 44). We had three very hot days which impacted on attendances. Even so there was an average of 61 participants.

In general numbers are very high prior to the Christmas break and then in the New Year numbers decline slightly as people then have training obligations with netball and football etc.

With the extension of daylight saving in 2008/2009 I will consider commencing the "Trot" earlier and finishing later.

We raised the excellent sum of \$1884.39 net profit.

GJ McDonald & Co. Real Estate was again the naming rights sponsor for the "Trot".

The results of each run were published in the Geelong Advertiser and mid way through the season in the Geelong News. The Geelong Advertiser decided in mid January not to publish in the Sports Results a "write up" of the event but to only publish the results. However, the Geelong News (when space was available) not only published the write up and results but also gave bold headlines to the write up. This gained a lot of interest from the participants (and especially the juniors) and was also good advertising for the Twilight Trot.

The "Trot" continues to attract new participants and also families which are great for promoting health and fitness in the Geelong community. I believe that with greater publicity the "Trot" can further increase in attendances.

Our junior U13 numbers were once again very good and because of this other members of the family are more likely to participate.

Participants appreciated the spot prizes which were handed out after each run and I found that a large percentage of people stayed until after the run to here the announcement of results and the awarding of the spot prizes.

Once again Mary ran "Introduce a Friend" whereby each person who introduced a new participant to the "Trot" went into a draw for an end of season prize of a \$10 DeGrandi voucher.

However, I found this year that the increased attendance numbers also increased the administrative responsibilities and I found it necessary to change the procedure at the Finishing Line with the recording of place getters and times. Also matters were not helped with a reduction in the number of people who were prepared to help which resulted in me being unable to compete this season.

The course for the Trot was varied between 1635m (short) and 2245m (long distance) course.

Each week participants were offered a choice of at least one lap of the designated distance for the week's event. Junior U13 participants were also permitted to run the maximum distance of the event and they were also timed for each lap. This was appreciated by the better junior runners as it helped them to improve their fitness over the longer distances and in preparation for cross country running. As a result of this policy I believe the Trot is attracting some very good junior runners and that their performances have improved during the season.

Course records were also kept for both the short and long courses for the various age groups. This also created an interest particularly with the juniors when they established new records. Personal best times were also reported in the write-up for the newspapers.

The final run for the season was the "Joyce Lockyer Memorial Trophy", handicap race for the senior runners over two laps of the long course. Peter Jepson was the winner of this Trophy. The juniors were also handicapped for one lap of the long course. The winner of the race was Mitchell Jepson. The winner and place getters each received medals. Following the run there was a BBQ and presentation of awards.
