HISTORY OF ATHLETICS IN GEELONG

Formal athletics started in Geelong as far back as 1892 when Geelong Grammar School joined the newly formed Victorian Amateur Athletic Association (VAAA) with our first State champions being W.S. Jones (hammer) and J.D. McRae (pole vault) in 1894.

The first Victorian Championship event to be held in Geelong was the VAAA 5 mile Cross Country Championship held at the Geelong Racecourse in 1921. In 2012, the Athletics Victoria Road Relay Championships being held at the Belmont Criterium on 11 August 12.

In December 1929 the Victorian Women's Amateur Athletic Association (VWAAA) was founded with Geelong women taking part from the first official competition in 1930.

In 1956 Geelong had six representatives in the Melbourne Olympics – Ron Blackney, John Chittick, Robert Joyce, John Landy, Don MacMillan and John Vernon.

1961 saw the first track event held at John Landy Field (without top surface), with the first Geelong Centre meet being held in 1962 between Geelong Guild, Lara and Geelong Teachers College.

1964 –1966 saw the **Gee**long Centre assist in the formation of the Geelong Little Athletics Centre, the number 1 **ce**ntre in Victoria.

1969 Geelong Centre hosted the VAAA Victorian Country Track & Field Championships and the Inter Centre Premierships for the first time at Landy Field.

1977 saw the laying of the 'all weather' rubberised bitumen track to replace the original cinder track.

1978 Geelong hosted the first ever, combined women's and men's Victorian Country Track & Field Championships, which for the first time attracted a major sponsorship from The Weekly Times.

May 1982 the Geelong Regional Centre was formed as a result of the merger of the Victorian men's and women's athletics associations.

1989 Geelong Regional Centre Incorporated in law as Geelong Athletics Inc.

1990 Geelong re-enters Melbourne's top Interclub competition, A Grade as a combined Centre.

1992-93 Landy Field redeveloped into an International standard 8 lane track.

1995 Barwon River flooded Landy Field on Melbourne Cup day to such a level there was 6 inches (150mm) of water in the WJP Wood Pavilion.

1998 Geelong Athletics hosted the first round of State League (A Grade) to be held outside of Melbourne.

1999 saw the use of photo-finish for the first time outside Melbourne at the Country Championships.

2001 Geelong Athletics hosted the National Schools Knockout Final and continued to host a round of State League.

2002 Geelong Athletics conducted the Oceania Veterans Championships over 10 days in January.

2003 St Joseph's Athletic Club decides not to re-affiliate with Athletics Victoria.

2004 Geelong Athletics purchases photo finish equipment and hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships.

2005 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Track & Field Championships under a different AV management structure, where AV received and processed all entries, the Centre providing the venue and the finances being distributed differently.

2005 The first Ron Clarke Classic is held on 17 December with World 40+ | hour time trial record set at the meet by Steve Moneghetti.

2006 Landy Field is closed for major upgrade – track to become standard IAAF configuration. Founding President of Geelong Athletics, Rudi Hochreiter passes away.

2007 Upgraded and reconfigured Landy Field re-opened for competition and training.

2008 Geelong hosts the National and All schools cross country championships at Eastern Park 23-25 August.

2008 The fourth and final (under this name) edition of the Ron Clarke Classic was conducted on 22 November.

2009 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (24-26 January) and the Australian Masters Games (21-25 February).

2010 Lighting installed at Landy Field in March

2012 The Victorian Road Relay Championships held at Geelong in August. The first time this event has been held outside of Melbourne.

2012 A 50th anniversary dinner held at Dromoland House on 7 December attended by 140 people including AV President, Ian Jones. Richard Lawysz, Gabrielle Blythe and Richard Colman all spoke of their time at Geelong and in athletics.

2013 Geelong hosts the Victorian Country Athletic Championships (26-28 January)

2013 Geelong hosts the Australian Masters Games in October.

2013 Life Member and former Geelong Officials Club President, Wes Marshman passes away.

2014, Life Member Jack Darcy passes away.

2015, New hammer cage installed and new equipment shed erected at Landy Field. Tom Lambert, passed, long time Geelong Officials, passes away.

2016, Geelong Athletics hosts the 2016 Victorian Country championships (22-24 January).

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2015-16

The recurring themes every season.

- (i) board vacancies.
- (ii) shield competition.
- (iii) update equipment and venue.

Shield at Landy Field commenced on Sat 10 Oct 15 and was based on the AV Shield 2 programme cycle, culminating in the Shield Final at Albert Park on Saturday 6Feb 16. Shield was again conducted as night meets on Saturday nights in Jan 16. Unfortunately two rounds were cancelled due to inclement weather with no opportunity to conduct replacement meets.

Many athletes achieved success at the Allschools in Melbourne as well as the respective Nationals in Sydney (Open) and Perth (Juniors).

We welcomed Hamish Nelson who fulfilled the role of the Summer Portfolio Manager this season to undertake the duties of this important position as well as Karen Kirby who took on the role for Publicity and Marketing. We continue to struggle collectively to filling sub committees.

I thank sincerely those who volunteered to "make it happen" and their input to improving athletics in Geelong. There are those "behind the scenes" in an unofficial capacity who undertake various tasks to assist the board in providing competition for our athletes. And the number of such volunteers is diminishing putting undue and unwarranted pressure on them to provide what the athletes want.

The current members of the Board are all intending stepping down at the end of this 2015-16 season. There seems to be a reticence to be involved and leave to others. Well it's time for a generational change and maybe a realisation of and appreciation of what is actually required to "make it happen", not just expect that "someone" will do so.

We still require more officials weekly to manage the conduct of the sport. We have had instances of athletes missing out on qualifiers or records. We are reliant on club helpers to put on events, yet athletes just want more.

The number of people willing to give of their time during the season and on Saturday afternoons is diminishing even further, thus putting extra burden on those who are still involved. I repeat again, to use the cliche, "many hands make light work" cannot be overstated.

We encourage all to becoming a qualified and registered official gives all of us the opportunity to be involved "in the action" and also assist in improving the presentation of events. Officials courses were arranged in Geelong in Sep15. But how many actually put into practice what they had learnt? Noting we had more attendees from outside of Geelong than within!

A reminder, the Commonwealth Games at the Gold Coast will be conducted on 4-15 April, 2018. In athletic terms, not that far away. From an officials' perspective, there are now Australian Athletics Officials with one training and education scheme to cover both Little Athletics and Senior competitions, you may refer to the Athletics Australia web site for details of the online e learning process.

We acquired an E-gun to assist with starting and made our track events run better. Also, the new hammer cage was finally erected in December 15.

We need to consider the style of competition, support and expansion of coaching programmes and training and increased participation of officials, marketing and promotion and use of the media.

The Geelong cross country teams achieved success, thanks primarily to Julian Spence winning the coveted Men division 1 title.

Our ongoing thanks to Mary and Geoff McDonald for their continued management and support of the Twilight Trot(25 years strong now!) series in summer, a most rewarding event for all concerned, health and social benefits for participants and financially for Geelong Athletics.

Geelong championships were conducted on Sundays 20Dec15 and 6Mar16. It is becoming more difficult to fit them into our already congested calendar so the discussion has to be had about their future, not to mention what has to be planned and put in place in order to put the programme on.

We need to cater for all our athletes, the vast range of talent requiring a vast range of needs to support their respective athletic careers, not to mention promotion of the sport itself. How do we keep the elite athletes competing at the local level?

We congratulate our athletes who competed internationally, Ned Weatherly, World Youth Championships in Cali, Colombia and Jayden Barnby and Coreena Cleland at the Oceania Championships in Cairns in May15. Also Jess Gulli, member of the national relay squad at the World Relay championships in the Bahamas in May15 and also the World championships in Beijing as well as the relay squad(to be confirmed) for the Rio Olympics. Lachlan Barber and Isaac Hockey have been selected for the World Juniors championships in Poland, and Damien Birkinhead for the Rio Olympic Games. We wish them well.

We need to offer more via the clubs and coaching programmes in order to encourage more Little Athletes to continue in the sport at senior level. We need to continue to bridge that perceived great divide, which is slowly narrowing between Little Athletics and Seniors by being interactive and cross promotion.

Unfortunately the proposed LA "Come and Try day" was cancelled due to the weather.

We need to dispel the myth that "senior athletics" is only for the elite. You can do the sport for enjoyment's sake itself. A more equitable balance of numbers would no doubt assist both organisations.

The Geelong Centre total athletic registrations continue to remain about the same, yet the clubs, through their endeavours, attracted 55 new athletes this season. We need to implement measures to retain and nurture those athletes to remain in the sport.

At the 2016 Victorian Country Championships conducted in Geelong, Chilwell won the Ex Athletes Cup(Female), Oliver Courtnay(Chilwell) was awarded the Joyce Lockyer memorial shield, Mia Gross(Geelong Guild), the Stuart Hunter

memorial shield and Corinna van der Klooster(Deakin) and Christian Davis(Corio), the Australia Day medals.

The annual presentation at the RSL, Belmont on Fri 8 Apr 16 was a success.

The Summer Meeting (25May 16) has been held and set the course for next season.

On Saturday 13Aug16, Athletics Victoria will be conducting the Eikeden relay at Anglesea as part of XCR16. We look forward to your support of this event and our own Geelong athletes.

Financially, the Geelong Centre is continuing to run a steady course.

It has been another challenging season, which one isn't? I especially thank our Portfolio Managers and sub committees, which I am disappointed to say there were very few if any, for their dedication to the sport and acknowledge and applaud their contributions and their personal support during the season.

I continue to challenge the clubs and give them the opportunity to fill vacancies on the Board and the sub committees, we do not want Geelong Athletics to become stale.

I thank Sally Hockey who was the Secretary for three years and unfortunately resigned due to personal reasons. Sally brought a refreshing view to the board table and we are all better for it.

Finally, I thank and acknowledge all the families, coaches, officials and club administrators who give of their time so generously to provide the athletes the opportunity to participate in their chosen sport. I trust their support is reciprocally appreciated.

Treasurer's Report 2015-16

Nicholas Mirarchi

The financial position of the Centre decreased slightly over the year by \$1,731.02. This decrease over the year included a high level of expenditure in relation to the 2015-16 Victorian Country Championships (Countries). Additionally, a contribution of \$2,500 towards the new equipment shed was required to be made to John Landy Field Management. Notwithstanding that as at 31 March 2016 the financial position had slightly decreased, this did not take into account subsequent reimbursements from Athletics Victoria in relation to Countries.

This assistance from Athletics Victoria (AV) is greatly appreciated and will prove to substantially advance the financial position of Geelong Athletics Inc. going into the new financial year. Considering that the season included less competition days than the last, attendance and takings for most weeks was promising. Twilight Trot yet again provided reliable cash flows throughout the season, especially during times where no other competition was providing fees. I would like to thank Geoff and Mary McDonald and all the other volunteers for their dedication, it was greatly appreciated.

I am therefore pleased to report that Geelong Athletics is in a healthy financial position notwithstanding that a large amount of expenditure was incurred for Countries. I have concentrated on the accounts with the largest movements, for further detail, refer to the attached ledgers.

Centre Administration (increase by \$4,262.95)

- Levies received as at year end were \$1,780.
- Equipment hire decreased slightly over the year, ending at \$4,995. This was welcome cash flow. I would like to thank all the caretakers who assisted over the year.
- Interest slightly decreased, ending at \$966.14. This can be accounted for by the \$5,500 withdrawal made last year to meet expenses.
- This year there was no hire of equipment for the Masters Games.
- Caretaker costs decreased during the year in accordance with lower levels of equipment hire.
- Insurance costs remained constant over the period (not taking into account possible increase after stocktake) ending at \$3,758.18.
- Another significant out

Geelong Championships (increase by \$981.50)

- Entry fees were slightly lower this year, ending at \$1,181.50. However this does not take into
 account moneys received subsequent to the year end, which are to be included in the
 financial reports into the new year.
- Venue hire costs invoiced as at the date of this report amounted to \$200.

Twilight Trot (increase by \$3,180.10)

- Another successful season, with an overall increase of fees to a total to \$2,721.00.
- Numbers were consistent over the year with periods of larger numbers.
- Sponsorship was also slightly higher at \$480.

We would like to thank all sponsors over the year for your support.

Summer Competition (increase by \$2,773.70)

- Competition fees saw a slight decrease, ending at \$6,733.20.
- Track lighting significantly increased this year with more night being made available, coming to \$1,710.
- JLFMC hire costs remained constant over the season, coming in at \$3,600.
- The facilities improved to an extent this year, however it appears that in some respects
 there is still room for improvement. Again, appears that some days (particularly Geelong
 Champs) are costing too much considering the time we actually use the track. This needs to
 be reviewed.
- Sponsorship was increased this year, coming in at \$1,200 for signage, and \$150 for the handbooks.

Country Championships (decrease by \$6,027.67)

- Track hire over the weekend came in at \$1,665 which include hire, and extra maintenance.
- For the purposes of our expenditure, catering and meal expenditure for the weekend was significant at a total of \$4,258.72. We note that all of this expenditure has subsequently been refunded by AV so we are very thankful.
- Additionally, handbook costs totalled \$913 with a recoupment of \$672 from sales.
- At the time of writing this report, approximately \$11,000 to \$12,000 will be received from AV in relation to countries.

It is important to reiterate that even though the net position of the Countries account has decreased over the year, subsequent reimbursements and contributions by AV into the new financial year will significantly bolster our financial position.

Further, it is stressed that holding events such as Countries is not only a privilege, but a major opportunity for the Centre to grow financially. Therefore, I would like to thank all the volunteers over the weekend, including those (not including myself) that provided crucial and material assistance for the setup, operation and pack-up for the event.

Winter Competition (increase by \$920.65)

- This season there was an increase the fees received, coming in at \$1,077.75.
- Expenditure in total was lower, with only \$157.10 being spent prizes and trophies.

Athletics Victoria (XC Championships) (decrease by \$1,742.70)

- Largest expenses were the uniform purchases of \$3,300 and the relay entries totalling \$2,465.
- Bus rental totalled \$544.28.
- Uniform sales over the season amounted to \$975 and sponsorship received amounted to \$2,818.18 – however this was mainly spent on acquisition of uniforms for the season.

I would like to thank the Board for its ongoing support in my duties. I would also like to thank the Board for its dedication to the Region and its commitment to furthering competition for Geelong athletes in general.

I now wish all the best to the incoming Board, and to their commitment athletics in Geelong.

SUMMER COMPETITION 2015-16

Shield competition at Landy Field commenced October of 2015 based on the AV Shield 10 round competition culminating with the Shield Final at Albert Park in February of 2016.

Poor weather and a reduction in rounds from 12 to 10 created a lower competition number for athletes. Generally poor attendance to earlier rounds of shield added to the sense of reduced participation this season.

Major changes to the running of weekly competition, was the implementation of pre-entry. Initially met with frustration by a few, the change in procedure was of greater assistance to the hard working few who tiredly enter data each round of competition. Changes to online entry for next season are being assessed, and assistance to process this information like many other things, will be required by everyone involved in Athletics in Geelong.

Zone vs Zone continued this season with no participation by Geelong due to travel, and low interest. Some athletes were able to participate but with qualifications rounds at either the very beginning of the season or during Victorian Country Championships again attendance was low.

The same was noted for overall Geelong participation in Shield Final with little interest in attending because of lengthy timetable, constant delays and lower standard of competition.

Steigen Pole Vault/10k event in December of 2015 drew a later crowd and participation numbers. Interesting r a Geelong Decathlon at the same time was shown however with a busy schedule for AV Shield events it is unlikely to be added into the calendar.

Participation and general interest in the Geelong Relays and Championships was extremely low and decisions on its future as part of the Geelong Athletics Calendar will be discussed.

The Victorian Country Championships were held on the Australia Day weekend in Geelong with a rocky start to timetabling with an increase in not only the number of athletes but also events offered during the Championships. Both Athletes and Officials conducted themselves in an exemplary manner with a positive experience for all involved and again the highlight for many for the athletics calendar.

The majority of issues faced this Summer season revolve around participation and general interest, not only for athletes in the events they wish to compete in but also by club helpers and officials who are required to run these events. The many jobs needed to complete 10 rounds of competition plus championships was taken on by a few, week in week out. For Athletics to continue in Geelong every single athlete/partner/parent will need to be involved in some way.

WINTER COMPETITION REPORT FOR 2015

The 2015 Geelong Athletics local cross country and road running season was conducted from May through to August 2015.

The Board were very reluctant to stage a winter season in 2015, without having a person take on the Board position. Two initial approaches by individuals in November 2014 and in the early part of 2015 were rejected by the Board.

Eventually, with little more than a few weeks to get organised, the winter season was set to be held. Albeit with the assistance of a dedicated band of volunteers who didn't want to see nothing happen.

A return to the events of previous seasons after running mainly from Landy Field in 2014, was well received.

The program again included the Geelong Cross Country Championships at Eastern Park and the Geelong Road Championships at Deakin University, Waurn Ponds.

The Geelong Cross Country Relay Championships were again held at Barwon Valley Fun Park and saw competition on the silver anniversary of the Stuart Robley Trophy. It was extremely pleasing to see AV and Geelong Life Member, Stuart Robley in attendance to present his trophy to the winning club, Chilwell.

The Winter Committee instituted a couple of new initiatives to improve communications. A dedicated Facebook page for the cross country season was created for the members and public alike. The page has received 116 likes so far. For the assistance of organisers a "Dropbox" through email has been created to have a central repository of documentation to share.

During the season a number of significant kilometre milestones were passed, including Michael Panckridge reaching 1,650km; Karen Wekwerth 1,500km; Peter Anderson 1,000km and Christopher Shelley passed 700km. Peter became only the fourth runner to surpass the 1,000km since records began in 1989. A photo was taken and a story submitted to the Geelong Advertiser, which unfortunately was not printed.

All in all, after a frantic effort to get the season off the ground, we have had good numbers all year and a successful season has been completed. It is to be hoped that a Portfolio Manager can be found early and that preparations can get underway much earlier for the 2016 winter season.

Participation

Results

Annual Report for Officials Portfolio 2016

It has been another busy aths year. This season, all shield programs were conducted on Saturdays along with one interclub. The Geelong championships were held over two Sundays, one in December and one in March. The Steigen and 10k was held on the 19th Dec.

Most days were well supported by volunteers who assisted at each event. The championship days were the most difficult as officials and helpers were scarce. Over the season, 83 people checked in for shield and championship duties. 20 of them assisted at more than half of the competitions and 2 – Richard Lawysz and Geni Kozdra - were present for all. A huge thank you to all who helped out.

This season, Geelong hosted the Victorian Country Championships. Even though Athletics Victoria was responsible for this event a huge amount of work was done by the locals. Richard Lawysz co-ordinated everything that was happening in Geelong. He ensured that this event was a success. No wonder he was awarded Athletics Australia's 'Official of the Year'. Congratulations, Richard.

During the championships, he did have the support of many people from our centre and I would like to thank everyone and anyone who assisted in any way. You all did Geelong proud. Some of the people have been writing about are registered officials but many are unregistered 'helpers'.

The aim at Geelong was to increase the number of registered and qualified officials. To this end, Richard Lawysz conducted 4 officials training seminars this season. One in each area of Tech/admin, track, throws and jumps – Level C. All were poorly attended and some attendees were not from Geelong. A photo finish and eGun training session for volunteers was scheduled in August and Sarah Davis from Ballarat also planned a session on Meet Manager but this was cancelled due to lack of participants. Therefore our goal was not met.

A new education system for officials was launched by Athletics Australia at the end of the season. The scheme starts at level one and goes through to level 5. Level One officiating courses are now available online with Athletics Australia. It would be advantageous to all at Geelong if more people completed these courses. Candidates must complete online learning and pass a multiple-choice quiz. The learning and quiz will focus on ensuring the candidate has a basic understanding of the rules of the discipline they are attempting. A practical session will then be held at a later date in Geelong. At this stage, higher level courses are held in Melbourne.

This season a 15 year milestone was reached by Anula Costa. Anula is an energetic worker for athletics. She is a qualified coach as well as an official and does both admirably. Congratulations Anula.

Also congratulations to Pauline Zuccolin, Anula Costa, and Lorraine Sawyer who were all nominated to take part in the IAAF TOECS Level 15 day training course next month. Richard is a presenter at the course. So you can see that Geelong does have a lot of expertise.

I have enjoyed the year. Thanks to all who assisted our program in any way.
